How's Business by Don Blyly

We've had computer-related headaches. First, there's the website. Our home page (with our list of events) sometime loads in 2 seconds, sometimes in 30 seconds. The Newsletter Archive page and the older newsletters that you can click to from that page also load very slowing at times. These problems started when our hosting service changed servers a while back, and we'll be contacting them again to try to get the problem resolved. However, the newer parts of our website, including the shopping pages, load quickly pretty much all of the time. So for speedy online shopping, please go directly to www.unclehugo.com/prod/gateway.php

Then there was the problem with our e-mail account. Over about a five day period, I received a couple dozen "Fw: Hi" or "Fw: News" messages with a suspicious link, all from various aol.com accounts. I didn't click the link on any of them. Then one night hundreds of "Fw: Hi" messages with a suspicious link were sent out as if from UncleHugo@aol.com. I changed my password early the next morning when I learned of the problem. Aol.com was aware of the problem, and that MANY older aol accounts had

been hit with this problem. Their story was that there are two different situations-in some cases the account had actually been hacked, in which case the "Fw: Hi" message would show up in the "Sent" file, and the message actually went through Aol servers; in most cases the Aol account name was being used to send messages through non-Aol servers. They alerted other major e-mail providers to not accept messages from Aol accounts unless the messages come from Aol servers. The "Fw: Hi" message did not appear in my "Sent" file, but it was obvious that it went to the addresses in my Aol address book. (All of the bounced back messages from Uncle Hugo's credit representatives at various publishing companies made it clear that it was from our address book, not just a random selection of addresses.) Aol claimed that 2% of their account were victims of this, but I heard a TV report that claimed it was closer to 20%.

The winter that refuses to end has continued to hurt business. Our business was WAY down for January, February, March, and April. We've heard the same is true for other local businesses. Government statistics says that bookstores nationwide saw a 9.5% decrease in sales in the first quarter. But around the first weekend of May, we had 4 break-even days in a row, for the first time since December. And the next weekend we had 3 days in a row of break-even or better. It's such a relief to at least break-even after months of heavy losses, and very nice to see some of our regular customers again!

The oldest LGBT bookstore in the U.S. is going out of business after 40 years (same age as Uncle Hugo's). The owner of the bookstore also owned the building (as is true of Uncle Hugo's/Uncle Edgar's). He had hoped that one of the specialty small publishers would buy his bookstore to insure continued retail exposure of their books, but nothing worked out. This reminded me of all the talk after Borders closed about how the publishers were so concerned about helping the independent bookstores survive, so that they could continue to be "show rooms" for the books that people then went to Amazon to order. I'm still waiting to see what they are going to do to help us survive. One of the smaller publishers that we do a little business with has decided to give retailers an extra 30 days to pay their bills. But from the big guys, I noticed a reduction in co-op advertising funds (which plays a small but appreciated role in helping to pay for this newsletter), but nothing else. (By the way, the newsletter also "show rooms" books that people then order from Amazon. We recently received a very generous contribution to the newsletter from a customer who buys e-books based on what he reads in our newsletter.)

Short Recommendations by Don Blyly

Peter F. Hamilton's **Great North Road** (\$7.99) is one of the best science fiction novels that I've read in some time. Hamilton tends to write big, fat books with lots of details that come in

series, but this is a stand-alone novel (though still full of details and over 900 pages long). One of the things that makes the book so good is the skill with which the details are smoothly worked into the plot, instead of stopping the story to provide an info-dump for the reader. Set about 130 years in the future, a clone in a powerful family is murdered in the north of England. About half of the book is a police procedural, as the local police try to figure out who was killed, by whom, how the local mob was involved, etc. But there is also a suspicion that an alien serial killer may have snuck onto Earth somehow, and the military is involved in that investigation. The plot jumps from planet to planet and back and forth in time to provide background of various characters and subplots, but it is always smoothly done. Highly recommended.

Blue Remembered Earth by Alastair Reynolds (\$8.99) is a very optimistic novel set about 150 years in the future, based on the idea that Africa became a peaceful, united power in the future, and one family from Kenya played a major role in spreading mankind through the solar system, led by Eunice Akinya. After decades of being a space pioneer, Eunice built herself a satellite that circles the moon and became a cranky recluse, leaving it to other members of her family to run the empire that she built. And most of the members of her family turn into ruthless capitalists and are happy to run her empire for her. When she dies at the age of 130, her two rebellious adult grandchildren, Geoffrey

(who doesn't care about the family business and just wants to study elephants) and his sister Sunday (who ran away from the family business to try to survive on the moon as an artist) decide to try to learn more about their grandmother. The rest of the family opposes this, fearing that they will uncover something about Eunice's early life and wild times that will be bad for the family business. It seems that Eunice left a series of clues scattered across the solar system, in hopes that Geoffrey and Sunday would break away from the family and follow the clues. In the process, the reader is taken on a tour of this future, where everybody on Earth has multiple brain implants (including one that prevents violence against other humans), where some humans have made changes to their bodies so that they can live under the seas, where colonies are prospering on the moon and on Mars, and robots are mining the asteroid belt and beyond. The book would be satisfying as a standalone novel, but Reynolds threw in some twists at the end so that he can write a trilogy, with the second volume, On the Steel Breeze (\$25.95) coming in June.

Craftsmen by Tom Doyle (\$24.99) with a favorable blurb from Larry Correia. Since I like Larry's writing so much, and this was the first time I had seen a blurb from him, I took the book home immediately to try it. I like Larry's books for their combination of fast action and a sense of humor. I think that anybody who likes Larry's books will also like American Craftsmen for its

fast action, but it does not have much humor. Since the Revolutionary War, there has been a special secret unit of the military made up of American magic users, who help fight the magic users of our enemies. Most of these "Craftsmen" have been from just a few families, and some of the families have histories of bad feelings towards each other. In modern times, somebody has infiltrated the Pentagon and has been sabotaging craft operations, trying to kill off the craftsmen, as well as trying to increase the bad feelings between the families. Soon, the bullets and the magic spells are flying, with living and dead craftsmen engaged in battle. Lots of interesting fast action, and clearly the beginning of a series.

When **Daughter of the Sword** by Steve Bein (\$7.99) arrived, I looked at the cover, with a woman holding a weapon against an indistinct background, and thought, "Oh, another one of those." But then I started hearing very favorable comments from customers, so I gave it try. It's very good. Set entirely in Japan, it features Oshiro Mariko, a young woman who has worked her way up to Detective Sergeant in the Tokyo Police in spite of the fact that most of the men in the department think women should not be allowed to be police. It also features some magical samurai swords that are about 1000 years old. A hitman for the mob has gotten his hands on one of the swords, which has been increasing its control over him ever since, demanding more blood. He and Oshiro will come into conflict. About half of the book is set in modern Tokyo,

and about half is set at various times over the last 800 years, as the reader watches how the swords have affected previous owners over the centuries. The book is very well researched, and filled with well-crafted characters. The sequel is **Year of the Demon** (\$16.00), and continues the police career of Oshiro and her fight against drug-dealing mobsters, with more magical artifact involvement. Highly recommended.

I usually like alternate history novels, but I'm not sure what to think of Blades of Winter by G. T. Almasi (\$9.99). The alternate history background is so promising. After Hitler and Stalin split Poland, Hitler kept his end of the bargain and turned all his forces to conquering all of Western Europe (including England) before the U.S. could get into the war. Without the war in Europe to worry about, the U.S. turns all its power to Asia, including sending lots of aid to Chiang Kai-shek, who quickly kills every Chinese communist he can find. Hitler and Stalin decide that splitting Poland worked so well that they agree to split the Middle East between them. When the U.S. takes Japan, they refuse to turn it over to Chiang Kai-shek. This makes him very angry with the U.S., but he then proceeds to gobble up lots more of mainland Asia. When Hitler doesn't see anyplace else to conquer, he tells his generals to plan for the invasion of the USSR; the generals decide that he's crazy and assassinate him. This leads to decades of cold war between the 4 major powers: Germany, Russia, China and the US. With such a promising premise, the book turns into a fight among

secret agents with comic book superhero powers. Yes, it's fun, but it could have been so much better. In the sequel, Hammer of Angels (\$9.99), the ExOps agents (the superhero agents of the Extreme Operations Division) are given a new assignment. Germany is very upset with the U.S. after all the destructive things "Scarlet" and her team of agents pulled in the first novel, and the government is threatening to join Russia and China against the U.S. After Hitler was killed by his generals in the early 1940s, the Nazis officially lost control of the German government, but the SS merely changed its name, the Gestapo is still operating under its old name, and all the Jews were turned into slave labor. Decades later, the German economy is completely dependent upon slave labor. So, the U.S. government decides to slip a lot of ExOps agents into western Europe to help the underground Circle of Zion to lead a slave uprising, but make it look like the Russians are behind it. Then, when the German economy is on the verge of collapse, the U.S. will offer to help crush the slave uprising if the Germans will stay allied with the U.S. The ExOps agents are first infiltrated into the British Isles, where "Scarlet" and her team not only help the Circle of Zion, but also start killing every Gestapo agent they can find. It turns out that killing Gestapo agents is a real crowd-pleaser in the former U.K., even among the German population. When "Scarlet" and her team discover that there is a mole within the Extreme Operations Division, they cut off communications with headquarters and take their destructive

road show through France, where killing Gestapo agents again turns out to be a crowd-pleaser. When the U.S. government orders all the ExOps agents to return home, Scarlet and her team have no way of knowing, and they continue their operations. Soon, Gestapo agents are being killed off by local resistance fighters throughout the German empire, and things spiral out of control of either the U.S. or German governments. The second book was enough fun that I'll probably pick up the next one, whenever it comes out.

Monster Hunter Nemesis by Larry Correia (\$27.00, due early July, signing at Uncle Hugo's July 3) is the fifth in the Monster Hunter series, and the books should be read in order. The series is known for lots of violent action and usually lots of humor. The first two books, Monster Hunter International (\$7.99) and Monster Hunter **Vendetta** (\$7.99) tell the story primarily from the point of view of Owen Pitts, but feature the entire Monster Hunter gang. Monster Hunter Alpha (\$7.99) followed a secondary character, while advancing the plot of the entire series. Monster **Hunter Legion** (\$7.99) went back to featuring Owen and the rest of the gang, as they and the monsters trash Las Vegas. Monster Hunter Nemesis once again follows a secondary character, Franks, the government agent who is actually Frankenstein's monster, still fighting evil after over 300 years. We learn a lot about Franks and about the government's Monster Control Bureau in the novel, while advancing the plot of the series. Franks has no sense of

humor, so there is little humor in the book, but there is plenty of violent action. Owen and the rest of the Monster Hunter gang only appear for a few pages in the book. There are some very interesting twists near the end of the book, and I'm eagerly awaiting the next novel, which will again feature Owen and the rest of the gang.

Dream London by Tony Ballantine (\$7.99) is an interesting and strange book. James Wedderburn fought in Iraq and in Afganistan before leaving the military and moving back to London, just before London started to change. He became Captain James Wedderburn (although he actually only made it to sergeant when he was in the military, but being Captain impresses people so much more) when London became Dream London. When he wakes up each morning, his bedroom is slightly different than it was when he went to bed the night before-sometimes wider, sometimes narrower, sometime with a higher ceiling, sometimes with a lower ceiling. The subway tracks have surfaced and are migrating. The airport has sunk into a swamp. The path of the Thames has altered, and a new river has opened to other worlds. The towers in the center of London just keep getting taller and taller. Dream London is influencing how people think. And various factions want Captain James Wedderburn to do their bidding. There are the people who used to be rich and powerful in the old London, who want him as their figurehead hero to bring back the old London. There is a crime boss from one of the other worlds who want James to help him carve out a larger territory

within Dream London. There is the CIA, which wants him to help figure out what is going on before the rest of the world nukes Dream London to keep it from spreading. There is the mansized amphibian who floated down the river, who wants James to help him become human. There is the woman who wants to marry him, because she bought a fortune scroll that claims he is the only ideal husband for her. And characters within the book argue about whether Dream London should be considered fantasy or science fiction.

Dream London reminded me of Dhalgren by Samuel R. Delany (\$20.00), but Dream London is about half as long, and I enjoyed it more.

Fire With Fire by Charles E. Gannon (\$7.99, a Nebula Award finalist) is the beginning of a series. Intelligence analyst Caine Riordan is forcefully recruited by a top secret international organization to investigate what happening on a colony planet. The controlling corporation on the planet is not only crooked, they are also trying to quietly exterminate the secretive intelligent race on the planet. Caine tries to learn more about the race so he can try to save it, and in the process he learns that the planet had been visited thousands of years before by at least one other interstellar intelligent race. After some odd plot jumps, Caine learns that the secret organization is in charge of looking for other space-faring intelligent races, and soon after he learns this, the organization is contacted by the Accord, an organization of space-faring intelligent races. The Accord has been watching

the humans for a long time, and has decided that it is time to determine if the humans should be invited to join the Accord. Caine, being the best expert on first contact after his experiences on the colony planet, becomes part of the human team to go to the Accord meeting. But the Accord has many plotting races struggling for power, and some of them are going to use the possible admission of the humans to try to increase their own power within the Accord. By the end of the book, it's obvious that the humans are about to be attacked by technologically superior aliens. I'm looking forward to the next installment, Trial by Fire (\$15.00, early August).

I haven't been a huge fan of steampunk. Even when I really enjoy a series, such as Gail Carriger's wonderful books, I find the steampunk element the least interesting part of the books. But I had been hearing good things about Court of the Air by Stephen Hunt (\$9.99) for so long that I finally tried it, and I loved it. This is a steampunk fantasy. On a planet that is clearly not Earth, there is the Kingdom of Jackals, which is very British, with the capitol city of Middlesteel, which is very similar to London. But it is not an island, and has land borders with Quartershift (recently taken over by the Commonsharists, who killed all the aristocrats and have engaged in so many purges that the country can no long feed itself) and with the Steammen Free State, ruled by King Steam. The Kingdom is full of humans and various other races, plus lots of steammen. The skies are

patrolled by airships, crewed by jack cloudies. The worldsingers use the power from ley lines to work their magic, partially to maintain control over those touched by the fey. In the tunnels under Middlesteel, there are ruins of an ancient insect race, which worshiped dark gods. A Jackals revolutionary has been bargaining with the dark gods, offering them lots of blood sacrifices if they will help him bring the Commonsharist revolution to Jackals, and he doesn't realize he is really a pawn of the dark gods. But mainly, Jackals is filled with very interesting characters, very interesting plots, and lots of swashbuckling adventure. As soon as I finished Court of the Air, I started on The **Kingdom Beyond the Waves** (\$7.99). Archaeology Professor Amelia Harsh, a very minor character in the first book, is obsessed with finding the legendary lost city of Camlantis. She is on an unauthorized expedition and opens an ancient tomb, where she discovers a horseless warwagon (much different from the modern clockwork horseless carriages) of the Black-oil Horde, which may contain the body of the legendary Diesela-Khan. I was hooked immediately. And I still have The Rise of the Iron Moon (\$7.99), Secrets of the Fire Sea (\$7.99), and Jack Cloudie (\$27.99) to look forward to.

Steve Perry's **The Vastalimi Gambit** (\$7.99) is the second in the Cutter's Wars series, following **The Ramal Extraction** (\$7.99). Colonel R. A. Cutter was a career military man until politics forced him to retire, at which point he assembled a mercenary force which most often

fights for interstellar corporations in skirmishes with other interstellar corporations. Most of his force is human, but it does include Kay, a member of the predatory Vastalimi race. Then Kay is called home by her brother, a healer, because of hundreds of the Vastalimi are dying of a strange new disease that he can't find a cause or cure for. Kay takes along the mercenary unit's human doctor, in case he can find something that the Vastalimi healers haven't been able to find. Meanwhile, the rest of the unit is working on an agricultural world for TotalMart, the galaxy's largest retailer. A competing retailer is trying to hijack the crop of a particular carrot-like plant that is only grown on one planet. The action keeps flipping back and forth between the two planets, with the Vastalimi story line being more interesting to me than the fire fights over carrots, but I did enjoy the entire book. I have to say that the alien pictured on the front cover is nothing like the image I have of the Vastalimi.

I had heard a lot of good comments about Lisa Shearin's Raine Benares series of humorous fantasies (Magic Lost, Trouble Found (\$7.99), Armed & Magical (\$7.99), The Trouble with Demons (\$7.99), Bewitched & Betrayed (\$7.99), Con & Conjured (\$7.99), and All Spell Breaks Loose (\$7.99)), but I never tried them. But when The Grendel Affair (\$7.99) came out and I saw it was the first of a new series, I decided to give it a try. This is another series where a young woman comes to New York City, discovers that it is full of supernatural bad guys, and becomes

involved with the supernatural. My favorite of this kind of story is the Esther Diamond series by Laura Resnick (with a lot more humor and some romance than in The Grendel Affair), but The Grendel Affair has lots of action (especially compared to Mur Lafferty's The Shambling Guide to New York City (\$15.00)). Makeena Fraser comes to New York City to make a career as a journalist, but she is hired by Supernatural Protection & Investigations because she is a seer. She is partnered with a more experienced agent, who is likely to become a romantic interest later in the series. But the first book in the series is so full of adventure there isn't time for romance. While SP&I is trying to simultaneously protect the ordinary humans and keep them from finding out about the supernatural critters that want to prey on them, somebody else has brought some descendants of Grendel to the New York subway system, to kill lots of people in Times Square on New Year's Eve in front of a world-wide tv audience. I enjoyed it and will probably pick up the next one. I might even go back and sample the earlier series.

Recommendations by Elizabeth LaVelle

When London isn't being supernaturally ravaged, things are a bit calmer around the Folly, as we see in **Broken Homes** (\$7.99) by Ben Aaronovitch. Molly is experimenting with recipes from the new cookbooks everyone has given her. There's Latin to study and formae to practice, as Peter and

Lesley continue their apprenticeships. And Peter is still spending time pursuing lines of inquiry that Nightingale and Lesley find irrelevant. Which is how he discovers that the Arts and Antiquities Squad has picked up a stolen antique German grimoire, which he traces to a theft at the National Trust home of an expatriate German architect, who designed Skygarden Tower in Southwark. Add to that the highly suspect apparent suicide of a Southwark Council planner, and the extremely unpleasant and unnatural death of the man who nicked the grimoire, and you can make a pretty good case that the Faceless Man is after something in Elephant and Castle. The trick, of course, will be finding out exactly what, and stopping him. Plus Peter attends Officer Safety Training, the Folly organizes the policing for the first-ever joint Spring Court of the God and Goddess of the River Thames, Peter's formae still occasionally explode unexpectedly - and we get to see what Nightingale can really do as a magician. But the thing I enjoyed most about this book? Peter's supposedly useless knowledge is what puts the case together - Lesley and Nightingale wouldn't have seen any of it.

In the mood for a straightforward old-school British procedural? Then the Inspector Sloan mysteries by Catherine Aird are just what you're looking for. I am very happy that Rue Morgue has been reprinting some of the earlier ones. The first in the series, **The Religious Body** (\$14.95, originally published in 1966), takes Inspector Sloan to the unfamiliar environs of the Convent

of St. Anselm. It looks like Sister Anne tumbled down the cellar stairs, but the lack of blood on the floor makes it clear the body has been moved. The case grows more confusing when pathologist Dr. Dabbe determines that she died well before Vespers. Someone was in her stall at the service - how did the imposter get into the convent, which should have been locked up tight? A tasteless Guy Fawkes prank at the nearby Agricultural Institute muddies the waters further - how did the students get their hands on the dead woman's missing eyeglasses? The investigation into Sister Anne's pre-convent life brings even more suspects and possible motives into the picture. Luckily, Sloan's sharp wits and considerable experience are up to the task of bringing the killer to book. The series continues with Henrietta Who? (\$14.95, originally published in 1968), in which a hitand-run near a quiet village proves to be homicide, not accident. When Dr. Dabbe's postmortem reveals that middle-aged Grace Jenkins couldn't possibly have been Henrietta Jenkins' mother, Inspector Sloan and his colleagues find their search for the killer greatly complicated. What was stolen from the locked desk in the cottage? What was the victim's real identity? How and why did she end up in the village? Who are Henrietta's real parents? The next six books in the series are also available, \$14.95 each, and Dead Heading (\$25.99, #24 in the series) will be available in mid-June.

Minnie Hamilton was thrilled to get a job as librarian in Chilson, Michigan. She's glad to be back in the small town where she spent happy childhood summers. Mostly she lives in her aunt's big house, but come summer Minnie relocates to a small houseboat to make room for her aunt's paying guests. And now she has company there: Eddie, a purring, mrrring, headbutting cat who followed her home one day. In Lending a Paw (\$7.99) by Laurie Cass, Minnie was not expecting Eddie to sneak aboard the district's brand-new bookmobile for its inaugural run. And she definitely wasn't expecting him to run off at a stop and lead her to the dead body of her friend Stan Larabee, who donated the money to buy the bookmobile. Her aunt's strange reaction to the news of Stan's death sends Minnie looking for answers. Why do most of the townsfolk have such a bad opinion of Stan? What was his connection to her aunt? And to local society matron Caroline Grice? Who had a motive to kill him? But the most important question of all is, how much trouble is Minnie going to be in if her boss finds out that, due to popular demand, Eddie has become a regular on the bookmobile runs? Ouite a bit of the book takes place at the library and aboard the bookmobile, and I really enjoyed Minnie's interactions with her patrons and co-workers, as well as with her friends and neighbors around town. I'm looking forward to spending more time with Minnie and Eddie and their friends when Tailing a Tabby (\$7.99) arrives in early July.

Kneading to Die (\$7.99, a 2013 Agatha Award finalist for Best First Novel) by Liz Mugavero introduces us to Kristan 'Stan' Connor, who has recently lost her high-powered PR job with an insurance company in Hartford, Connecticut. When her best friend Nikki gets tired of Stan's moping and drags her along to take a rescue dog to its new home, Stan falls in love with a pretty little house in the small town of Froq Ledge, and decides that a change of scenery is just what she and her Maine coon cat Nutty need. Stan is an independent, urban woman who is quite happy to find herself in a less frantic, friendlier small town milieu, where it's easy to walk or bike to the local shops, and the air is fresh (except for the occasional whiff of manure from the local dairy farm). When Stan finds the local veterinarian murdered - and, as the town newcomer, finds herself under suspicion - her attempts to find out more about the locals and the vet turn up plenty of other suspects, including her best friend Nikki. Mugavero does a great job populating the town with interesting characters, especially Ray and Char Mackey, owners of the Alpaca Haven bed & breakfast / alpaca farm; Izzy Sweet, purveyor of fine coffe and delicious sweets; and bar owner Jake McGee. And of course assorted pet cats and dogs, all of whom love the healthy snacks Stan bakes for Nutty and for Nikki's pet adoption events. Throw in a local farmer's market, a costume party on the town green, and a rescue dog named Scruffy, and it wasn't long before I found myself liking Frog Ledge as much as Stan does! I've just

started reading the next book in the series, A Biscuit, A Casket (\$7.99).

A bit further north is the town of Busman's Harbor, where Barbara Ross brings us the sights, sounds, smells, and tastes of Maine, as well an occasional murder. Clammed Up (\$7.99, a 2013 Agatha Award finalist for Best Contemporary Novel) introduces us to Julia Snowden, recently returned to her hometown from New York City, where she worked in the high-pressure world of venture capital. Now she's doing her best to save her family's clambake business, which has been hard hit by her father's death and by decreased tourism. On the line? Dozens of jobs, Morrow Island - which has been in her mother's family for generations, and is where they hold the clambakes - and her mom's house in town. Julia is organized and smart about business, and she's decided to try having weddings and receptions on the island to help increase revenue. But the very first event has to be cancelled after the best man is found hanged in the old mansion on the island. With the clambake shut down while the police investigate, and the bank threatening to call in the loan, Julia decides to do some sleuthing of her own. In Boiled Over (\$7.99, #2 in the series), Busman's Harbor has decided to hold a Founder's Weekend Festival to draw in tourists, with a variety of events and local food cooked at the pier. To bring the clambake ashore from the island, Julia's brother-in-law Sonny has put together a 20-foot by 4-foot contraption (dubbed the Claminator) to cook the lobsters, clams, corn,

potatoes, onions, and eggs they serve. His plans definitely did not include someone stashing a Festival organizer's dead body in the Claminator's firewood. When Sonny's assistant runs off, suspicion naturally falls on him, but the Snowdens can't believe the young man is a killer, so once again Julia decides to investigate. This is a warm-hearted small town series with great characters. Local cop Jamie Dawes may have been sweet on Julia since high school, but he still refuses to fill her in on confidential investigation details. Gus won't serve anyone he doesn't know at his restaurant and despite his curmudgeonly exterior, he's willing to give Julia advice to steer her right when she gets her priorities wrong. Cab driver / landscaper / bouncer Chris Durand, even better looking than he was back in high school when Julia developed her crush on him, has proven to be a good listener. And Julia's family really take care of each other, despite occasional squabbles (or, in the case of Sonny and Julia, shouting matches).

The Agatha Mistery books (\$5.99 each, ages 7 and up, chapter books with black & white illustrations) star twelve-year-old Agatha, an aspiring mystery writer with an amazing memory, sharp observational skills, and a keen sense of adventure. Her regular co-stars are her fourteen-year-old cousin Dash (short for Dashiell), who is studying - well, mostly dodging his assignments - at a prestigious detective academy, and Chandler, a formidable ex-boxer turned butler. The books are fast-paced

and humorous, and features assorted members of the scattered and eccentric Mistery Clan, who tend to embrace unusual careers, like camel breeding or hot air balloons design. The Curse of the Pharaoh (#1) takes them to Egypt's Valley of the Kings to help a team of archaeologists recover a clay tablet, vanished from their dig, that may reveal the location of a previously undiscovered tomb. This is a school exam for Dash, but it is actually Agatha's quick wits that turn up the clues and find a way to trick the culprit into giving himself away. The series continues with The Pearl of Bengal (#2), The King of Scotland's Sword (#3), The Heist at Niagara Falls (#4), and The Eiffel Tower Incident (#5). The Treasure of the Bermuda Triangle (#6) is expected in mid-July.

- McNeal, Tom -- Far Far Away \$9.99 (YA; Shortlisted for the National Book and Edgar Awards. Jeremy has been an outsider since he admitted he hears voices, specifically the voice of the ghost of Jacob Grimm, who is protecting him from an unknown evil whispered about in the space between this world and the next. - Setterfield, Diane -- Bellman & Black \$16.00 (In a boyhood competition, William Bellman aimed his slingshot at a rook, killing it, a small cruel act he soon forgot. But rooks don't forget. Yolen, J/Stemple, A -- The Hostage Prince \$7.99 (Seelie Wars #1: Kids; Due to a series of misunderstandings, a prince and a midwife's apprentice find themselves on the run, having adventure after mishap after escape. - Waters, M.D. -- Archetype \$16.00 (In a future where fertile women are a rare commodity, Emma is held captive by the love of two men one her husband, the other her worst enemy. If only she could remember which is which.)

- Miller, John Jackson -- **Kenobi** \$7.99 (Star Wars: The Republic has fallen. Sith Lords rule the galaxy. Jedi Master Obi-Wan Kenobi has lost everything except hope. But as tensions escalate between the farmers of Tatooine and a tribe of Sand People led by a ruthless war

- chief, Ben finds himself drawn into the fight, endangering his mission there.)

To the west, Napoleon has set out to add Russia to his list of conquests. It is outside the gates of Moscow that a reunited Laurence and Temeraire along with some unexpected allies and old friends will face their ultimate challenge.)
- Patel, Carrie -- The Buried Life \$7.99

 (PBO; When Inspector Liesl Malone investigates the murder of a renowned historian, she finds herself stonewalled by the all-powerful Directorate of Preservation, the top-secret historical research facility of the underground city of Recoletta. And when a second high-profile murder threatens the very fabric of city society, Malone and her rookie partner Rafe Sundar must tread carefully in the gaslight and shadows.)
- Pratchett, Terry -- The Truth \$9.99
 (Discworld #25: Reissue; When William de Worde hits on the idea of producing his upper-crust newsletter with a newfangled printing press, his Ankh-Morpork Times is a big success. Now certain nefarious factions would like nothing better than to put him out of business. They start the rival Ankh-Morpork Inquirer, full of

salacious bits, to do just that. Then Lord Vetinari is accused of a serious crime in a seemingly airtight case. But de Worde knows that facts aren't always the whole story. With a prim assistant, a roving vampiric photographer, and a talking dog who holds the key to the mystery, he sets out to get the truth.)

Pratchett, Terry -- Thief of Time \$9.99
(Discworld #26: Reissue; On the Discworld, Time is a resource managed by the highly capable Monks of History, who store it and pump it from places where it is wasted, like underwater (how much time do fish really need?), to places where there's never enough of it, like cities. Ironically, the construction of the world's first truly accurate clock threatens to stop Time altogether. And so begins a literal race against Time for the monk Lu Tze and his apprentice. For if the perfect clock starts ticking, Time as we know it will stop - and then the trouble will really begin.)

Pratchett, Terry -- Night Watch \$9.99
(Discworld #27: Reissue; Commander Sam Vimes of the Ankh-Morpork City Watch had it all. But now he's back in his own rough, tough past. Living in the past is hard. Dying in the past is incredibly easy. But he must survive, because he has a job to do. He must track down a murderer, teach his younger self how to be a good copper, and change the outcome of a bloody rebellion. Truth! Justice! Freedom! And a Hardboiled Egg!)

- Pratchett, Terry -- Monstrous Regiment \$9.99 (Discworld #28: Reissue; War has come to the Discworld - again. And to no one's great surprise, the conflict centers on the small duchy of Borogravia, which has long prided itself on its aggressiveness. Since her brother Paul marched off to battle, Polly has been running her family's inn - even though the revered national deity has decreed that female ownership of a business is an Abomination (with, among others, oysters, rocks, and the color blue). To keep the inn in the family, Polly must find her brother. So she cuts off her hair, dons masculine garb, and - aided by a well-placed pair of socks - sets out to join this man's army.)
- Radford, Irene -- The Wandering Dragon \$7.99 (Children of the Dragon Nimbus #3: PBO; To get away from home, family, and the University Magicians, journeyman magician Lukan gathers a small band of friends to help him find and rescue his mentor Master Robb.)
- Richardson, Kat -- Revenant \$25.95 (Greywalker #9: Harper and Quinton suspect that James Purlis and his Ghost Division are involved in a trail of grotesque crimes and black magic sweeping through Europe. Now an ancient cult has allied with Purlis, with even more nightmarish goals.)
- Ringo, John -- Islands of Rage and Hope \$25.00 (Black Tide Rising #3: To retake North America from the infected, Wolf Squadron is going to need a vaccine. But to produce it,

- they'll have to venture into a sea of the infected to secure the needed materials.)
- Sagara, Michelle -- Cast in Flame \$14.95 (Elantra #10: PBO; Teela calls Kaylin to the fief, where a small family disagreement has become a complicated problem: Castle Nightshade's latent magic is waking.)
- Salvatore, R.A. -- Rise of the King \$27.95 (Forgotten Realms: Companions Codex #2: As the changes wrought by the Sundering begin to take hold, the orcs of Many Arrows lay siege to the dwarf kingdoms of the Silver Marches. When word of the assaults reaches Drizzt and his Companions, Bruenor plots vengeance.)

- Krinard, Susan -- **Black Ice** \$14.99 (Midgard #2: PBO; In San Francisco, with the eyes of the gods and goddesses of an old world upon her, the Valkyrie Mist must thwart trickster god Loki's plans for modern-day Earth.)
- Marr, Melissa -- The Arrivals \$14.99 (Chloe goes to sleep, drunk and heartbroken, in Washington, DC, and wakes up in the Wasteland. - Smith, Karen Rose -- **Deadly Decor** \$7.99 (Caprice De Luca #2: PBO; When her sister Bella's old flame, a house painter who works for Caprice, turns up murdered, the police suspect Bella's husband. Can Caprice track down the real culprit?)
- Smith, Tom Rob -- The Farm \$26.00 (Caught between his retired parents, Daniel unwillingly becomes his mother's judge and jury as she tells him a tale of secrets, lies, a horrible crime, and a conspiracy that implicates his father.)
- Tan, Cheryl Lu-Lien (ed) -- Singapore Noir \$15.95 (Anthology. Original stories set in Singapore.)
- Taylor, Patrick -- **Pray for Us Sinners** \$15.99 (Davy MacCutcheon #1: Belfast, 1973: A British Army bomb-disposal expert goes undercover in

Bambery recounts the struggles for nationhood, charting the lives of Scots who changed the world, as well as those who fought for the cause of ordinary people at home.)

When his suspicions about a spate of apparent suicides among the London elderly are dismissed by the Murder Squad he was once part of, he is forced to investigate alone.)
- Cabasson, Armand -- Wolf Hunt \$15.95

 (Quentin Margont #2: Napoleon's army is in Austria, where Lt. Lukas Relmyer and fellow orphan Franz were kidnapped four years ago, and Franz was murdered. When the body of another

- orphan is found, Capt. Quentin Margont and Lukas join forces to track down the killer.)
- Davis, Lindsey -- The Ides of April \$15.99
 (Flavia Albia #1: Settled in her father Falco's ramshackle former digs in Fountain Court,
 Flavia Albia is working as a private informer.
 Hired to help investigate a fatal accident, she finds herself stuck with a truly awful client, facing a well-heeled, well-connected opponent.
 When her client dies under suspicious circumstances, it's just one of a series of similar deaths and Flavia is now a suspect.)
- Doiron, Paul -- Massacre Pond \$15.99 (Mike Bowditch #4: A wealthy animal rights activist is buying up land to create a new national park. Maine game warden Mike Bowditch investigates when someone leaves moose carcasses on the woman's estate; the case grows more sinister when the woman's daughter is killed in a suspicious car accident.)
- Evanovich, Janet -- Takedown Twenty \$8.99
 (Stephanie Plum #20: When powerful mobster
 Uncle Sunny goes on the lam in Trenton, New
 Jersey, it's up to bounty hunter Stephanie to
 find him. Nobody wants to turn him in not his
 poker buddies, not his bimbo girlfriend, not
 his right-hand men. Plus Uncle Sunny is Joe
 Morelli's godfather, and while Morelli
 understands that the law is the law, his oldworld grandmother Bella is doing everything she
 can to throw Stephanie off the trail.
 Meanwhile, security specialist Ranger needs
 Stephanie's help to solve the bizarre death of

To top things off, Ranger has been targeted for death. He dodged the bullet this time, but he'll need Stephanie's help to survive the next attempt. Death threats, highly trained assassins, highly untrained assassins, and Stark Street being overrun with a pack of feral Chihuahuas are all in a day's work for Stephanie Plum.)

Franklin, T/Fennelly, B -- The Tilted World \$14.99 (A story of murder and moonshine, sandbagging and saboteurs, dynamite and deluge, and a man and a woman who unexpectedly find love, set against the backdrop of the 1927 Mississippi flood.)

Furst, Alan -- Midnight in Europe \$27.00 (Paris, 1938: Spanish lawyer Cristian Ferrar is asked to help a clandestine agency that is trying desperately to supply weapons to the Spanish Republican Army. Joining Ferrar in this mission is an unlikely group of idealists, gangsters, arms traders, aristocrats, and

- spies. Across the continent, Ferrar and his allies do battle with the secret agents of Hitler and Franco.)
- Goodwin, Jason -- The Baklava Club \$26.00 (Investigator Yashim #5: Three naive Italian liberals, exiled in Istanbul, have bungled their instructions to kill a Polish prince, and instead abducted him. But their revolutionary cell has been infiltrated by their enemies, who are passing along false orders. It falls to Yashim to unravel all this.)
- Grabenstein, Chris -- Free Fall \$14.95

 (John Ceepak #8: Wise-cracking cop Danny Boyle and straight-arrow Chief of Detectives John Ceepak do their best to help Danny's friend, a young nurse who claims she's been falsely accused of aggravated assault by a prestigious Jersey shore doctor. When one of the nurse's home health care patients turns up dead, Ceepak and Danny have to wonder. Did they just help a friend get away with murder?)
- Hall, Rachel Howzell -- Land of Shadows \$24.99 (When a teenage girl is found hanging in an unfinished unit at a condo construction site, it could be suicide, but Los Angeles homicide detective Lou Norton isn't buying the easy answer especially since the condos are owned by the man Lou suspects is responsible for her sister's disappearance years ago.)
- Hamilton, Steve -- Let It Burn \$15.99 (Alex McKnight #10: A trip to Detroit reminds Alex of the last case he worked as a cop there, which was solved after he left; he does a little

digging, and finds out that the real culprit may still be out there, preying on more victims.)

- Hawken, Sam -- Tequila Sunset \$14.95 (El Paso, Texas, and Ciudad Juarez, Mexico, share streets and families. And one gang rules over it all: Los Aztecas. A reluctant gang member, an El Paso police officer, and a Mexican federal agent become involved in a complex struggle between law and crime, violence and order, and life and death.)
- Healey, Emma -- Elizabeth Is Missing \$25.99 (Maud is slowly losing her memory, and her grip on everyday life. Yet she refuses to forget her best friend Elizabeth, whom she is convinced is missing and in terrible danger. But no one will listen to Maud - not her frustrated daughter Helen, not her caretakers, not the police, and especially not Elizabeth's son Peter. Armed with handwritten notes she leaves for herself and an overwhelming feeling that Elizabeth needs her help, Maud resolves to discover the truth and save her beloved friend. But the clues seem only to lead her deeper into her past, to another unsolved disappearance: her sister Sukey, who vanished shortly after World War II.)
- Highsmith, Patricia -- The Two Faces of January \$16.00 (Reissue; In a grubby Athens hotel, Rydal Keener is bored and killing time with petty scams. When he impulsively agrees to help Chester McFarland dispose of a body, then meets

- Chester's younger wife, he becomes entangled in their sordid lives.)
- Hodgson, Antonia -- The Devil in the Marshalsea \$15.95 (1727: In the Marshalsea debtor's prison, Tom Hawkins learns that he'll have to pay for his food, bed, and drink. Also, there's a murderer on the loose and a ghost haunting the gaol. He accepts an offer of free room and board from the mysterious Samuel Fleet, only to find out that Fleet's last roommate turned up dead. Tom must get to the truth of the murder or be the next one to die.)
- Jungstedt, Mari -- Dark Angel \$14.95

 (Anders Knutas #6: A successful event planner has left his wife and children for his new lover. When he turns up murdered, the spurned wife is a natural suspect. But the motive widens when three cottages are set on fire on Gotland Island. Detective Anders Knutas must unravel the truth to catch the killer.)
- Knowles, Mike -- The Buffalo Job \$12.95
 (Wilson #5: The art heist was a chance for Wilson to get back in the game. The art came off the wall, the alarm screamed, and Wilson walked away clean. But it turns out that job was an audition for a bigger heist: a dangerous man wants Wilson to get him something more valuable than a painting.)
- Kuhns, Eleanor -- Cradle to Grave \$25.99
 (Will Rees #3: 1797: After Lydia's friend Mouse kidnaps five children, claiming their mother is unfit, Will and Lydia return to the Mount Unity Shaker community. While they learn that the

children would be better off with Mouse, they cannot protect her from the legal consequences. But they are determined to investigate after Mouse is accused of murdering the mother.)

- Lovegrove, James -- Gods of War \$14.95 (Sherlock Holmes: PBO; 1913: Europe is in turmoil, a powder keg awaiting a spark. When a body is discovered on the shore below Beachy Head, the local police think it's suicide, but Holmes suspects murder. As he and Watson investigate, they uncover a conspiracy with shocking ramifications.)
- MacBride, Stuart -- A Song for the Dying \$24.99 (Ash Henderson #2: Eight years ago, The Inside Man murdered four women, then just disappeared. Ash Henderson was DI on the investigation. Now Ash's career is in tatters, and one of Oldcastle's worst criminals intends to see him spend his life in prison. But when a nurse turns up dead Inside-Man style, Ash might finally get a shot at redemption and earning his freedom.)
- McGee, James -- Rapscallion \$15.95 (Matthew Hawkwood #3: For a French prisoner of war, there is only one fate worse than the gallows: the prison ships. Few survive their dreadful conditions, and escape is said to be impossible. Yet reports persist of a sinister smuggling operation within this brutal world. When the officers sent to investigate disappear, the Royal Navy turns to Bow Street for help. It's time to send in Hawkwood.)

- McNeal, Tom -- Far Far Away \$9.99 (YA; Shortlisted for the National Book and Edgar Awards. Jeremy has been an outsider since he admitted he hears voices, specifically the voice of the ghost of Jacob Grimm, who is protecting him from an unknown evil whispered about in the space between this world and the next. When classmate Ginger takes an interest in Jeremy and his ability, they find themselves at the center of a series of disappearances in their hometown.)
- Morrell, David -- Murder as a Fine Art \$16.00 (19th century London: In a series of horrific murders, the killer seems to be imitating Thomas De Quincey's true crime pamphlet. Determined to prevent more atrocities, but crippled by opium addiction, De Quincey searches for the killer, aided by his daughter Emily and two determined Scotland Yard detectives.)
- Nakamura, Fuminori -- Evil and the Mask \$15.95 (It is a tradition in their wealthy family: the aging patriarch will beget one last child to cause misery in a world that cannot be controlled or saved. From this point on, Fumihiro will learn to create as much destruction and unhappiness as possible. But as his education progresses, Fumihiro begins to question his father's mandate, and resists.)
- Patterson, J/Roughan, H -- Second Honeymoon \$10.00 (FBI Agent John O'Hara is on the trail of a serial killer who is targeting honeymooners, while Special Agent Sarah

- Brubaker is hunting a serial killer whose victims all have one chilling thing in common.)
- Reichs, Kathy -- Bones of the Lost \$7.99 (Temperance Brennan #16: Tempe's examination of a teenage girl killed in a hit-and-run triggers an investigation into an international human trafficking ring.)
- Rowling, JK/Galbraith, R -- The Silkworm \$28.00 (Cormoran Strike #2: After a novelist completes a manuscript that would ruin lives, then disappears, PI Cormoran Strike is hired to investigate.)
- Runcie, James -- Sidney Chambers and the Problem of Evil \$17.00 (Grantchester #3: Canon Sidney Chambers attempts to stop a serial killer with a grievance against the clergy, investigates the disappearance of a famous painting, uncovers the fact that a drowning on a film shoot may not have been accidental, and discovers the reasons behind the theft of a baby from a hospital just before Christmas 1963.)
- Sayers, D/Walsh, J -- The Late Scholar \$25.99 (Wimsey & Vane #4: To settle a dispute among the Fellows of St. Severin's College over the disposition of a valuable manuscript, Peter and Harriet head to Oxford. When several of the fellows die unexpectedly, the Wimseys must uncover what is really going on at the college.)
- Smith, Dan -- **The Child Thief** \$14.95 (A troubled Great War veteran races across the

frozen steppe of 1930s Ukraine to save a child from a shadowy killer with unthinkable plans.)

- Snicket, Lemony -- Who Could That Be at This
 Hour? \$7.00 (All the Wrong Questions #1:
 Kids; In a town far from anyone he knew or
 trusted, a young Lemony Snicket began his
 apprenticeship in an organization nobody knows
 about. He started by asking questions that
 shouldn't have been on his mind. Now he has
 written an account that should not be
 published, or read.)
- Todd, Charles -- A Question of Honor \$14.99
 (Bess Crawford #5: Agatha Award winner. 1918:
 Ten years ago in India, an officer in Colonel
 Crawford's regiment was discovered to have
 killed five people, but was never brought to
 trial, and reportedly died in the Khyber Pass.
 While tending the wounded in France, Bess
 learns that the supposed murderer is serving at
 the Front, and uses her leave to investigate.
 Conflicting reports of the man and the events
 leave her determined to find him and let the
 courts decide.)
- Upson, Nicola -- The Death of Lucy Kyte \$15.99 (Josephine Tey #5: When Josephine inherits her godmother's Suffolk cottage, she becomes intrigued by a murder committed on the grounds a century earlier. The old crime still seems to haunt the remote village. Is it superstition, or is a very real threat frightening the locals? And what of the mysterious Lucy Kyte, also named in her

godmother's will? No one in the village will admit to knowing her.)

Xiaolong, Qiu -- Enigma of China \$15.99
 (Chen Cao #8: Chief Inspector Chen Cao is a
 rising cadre in the party, in line to take over
 the top political position in the Shanghai
 police department, and a highly respected
 policeman. Which is why he's brought in by the
 Party to sign off on the investigation into the
 death of an important party member. Though
 everyone wants it to be a suicide, the evidence
 doesn't add up.)

Early July

Averbeck, Jim -- A Hitch at the Fairmont \$16.99 (Kids; 1956: 11-year-old Jack is determined to find out who kidnapped his aunt, and the truth behind his mother's death. He finds an unlikely accomplice in Alfred Hitchcock, on a madcap journey full of hidden doorways, secret societies, cryptic clues, and sinister villains.)

Barclay, Linwood -- A Tap on the Window \$9.99
(A girl drenched in rain taps on PI Cal
Weaver's car window and asks for a ride. Even
though he knows a man picking up a teenage
hitchhiker is a fool, he lets her in. After a
brief stop at a roadside diner, Cal senses that
something's not right with the girl or the
situation. But it's too late. He's already
involved.)

- Barrett, Lorna -- Not the Killing Type \$7.99
 (Booktown #7: It's time for the Chamber of
 Commerce elections, with the Chamber president
 being challenged by Tricia's sister Angelica.
 Then Stan Berry throws his hat in the ring.
 When Stan is found murdered, Angelica asks
 Tricia to help her clear her name and win the
 election.)
- Bass, Jefferson -- Cut to the Bone \$9.99
 (Body Farm Prequel: 1992: Dr. Bill Brockton sets out to create the Body Farm and revolutionize the study of forensics to help law enforcement. But his plans are derailed by a series of murders that are eerily similar to cases he's worked on in the past.)
- Beaton, M.C. -- Something Borrowed, Someone Dead \$7.99 (Agatha Raisin #24: Agatha is hired to find out who poisoned a widow with a nasty habit of borrowing things and not giving them back.)
- Blackwell, Juliet -- A Vision in Velvet \$7.99 (Witchcraft #6: PBO; When she buys an antique trunk full of old clothes, Lily finds a cape that shows her visions from the past. And when the dealer who sold her the trunk is murdered, Lily suspects a supernatural force might be behind his death.)
- Borjlind, Cilla & Rolf -- Spring Tide \$12.95 (Olivia Ronning hopes to follow in her father's footsteps and join the Nordkoster police when she completes her training. When her professor challenges her to pick a cold case and solve

- it, she doesn't realize the danger she will face, or the ugly truths she will uncover.)
- Box, C.J. -- **The Highway** \$9.99 (When two sisters set out across a remote stretch of Montana road to visit a friend, the women and their car vanish. Cody Hoyt has just lost his job with the police, but decides to look into things, and discovers these aren't the first women to disappear in the area.)
- Brown, Rita Mae -- Nine Lives to Die \$26.00 (Mrs. Murphy #22: The suspicious deaths of two mentors for a youth organization. Severed human fingers in a pencil jar at St. Cyril's Church. Then the animals make a gruesome discovery in the woods. Terrible crimes have been committed in Crozet, and somebody's gone to great lengths to cover them up. Harry and her posse of pet detectives investigate; Signed copies expected)
- Brown, Sandra -- **Deadline** \$8.00 (A call from an FBI source puts a battle-fatigued journalist just back from Afghanistan on the trail of a pair of domestic terrorists who have eluded capture for decades.)
- Budewitz, Leslie -- Crime Rib \$7.99 (Food Lovers' Village #2: PBO; A top TV cooking show is coming to Jewel Bay, Montana, and Erin has set up a steak-cooking competition with local chefs. When one of them is murdered, Erin has to grill some suspects to smoke out the killer.)
- Burke, James Lee -- **Light of the World** \$9.99 (Robicheaux #20: Louisiana detective Dave

- Robicheaux and his longtime friend and partner Clete Purcel are vacationing in Montana's spectacular Big Sky country when a series of suspicious events leads them to believe their lives, and the lives of their families, are in danger.)
- Bush, Nancy -- I'll Find You \$7.99 (PBO; A year after the accident that killed her husband and son, Callie Cantrell is trying to start over when ex-cop West Laughlin barges into her life, looking for his missing nephew.)
- Cabot, Sam (Dews/Rozan) -- Blood of the Lamb \$9.99 (Noantri #1: Jesuit priest Thomas Kelly and art historian Livia Pietro search Rome for a centuries-old document that was stolen from the Vatican; they are pursued by men willing to cross any line to obtain the document for themselves. And Livia has a secret of her own: she and her people are vampires.)
- Cameron, Christian -- King of the Bosporus \$14.95 (Tyrant #4: Satyrus and Melitta are older, and battle-hardened. They will leave the protection of Alexander the Great's former general Ptolemy and seek revenge on Heron, the man who murdered their mother, and who now rules the land that is their by right. Now it is time to go to war.)
- Camilleri, Andrea -- Angelica's Smile \$16.00 (Montalbano #17: The criminals behind a rash of burglaries have grown so brazen that their leader is sending menacing letters to Inspector Montalbano. The police are stumped, but when

- one of the burglars turn up dead, Montalbano must unmask his challenger.)
- Cass, Laurie -- Tailing a Tabby \$7.99
 (Bookmobile Cat #2: PBO; When a local artist needs emergency care, Minnie rushes him to the hospital in the bookmobile. When he's later found slumped over a murder victim's body, can Minnie and Eddie clear his name and catch the killer before someone else checks out?)
- Cates, Bailey -- Some Enchanted Eclair \$7.99 (Magical Bakery #4: PBO; A Revolutionary War movie is being filmed in Savannah's historic district, and Katie and her coven are working as extras. When someone murders a crew member, can the witches find the killer?)
- Cleeland, Anne -- Murder in Thrall \$7.99
 (Sinclair & Doyle #1: DCI Michael Sinclair, a British lord turned cop, chooses new detective Kathleen Doyle for his partner because she always knows when someone is lying, a trait that comes in handy when interviewing suspects and witnesses. They are sent to investigate the murder of a trainer at a racetrack; a series of related killings drag them into ever more perilous situations.)
- Corley, Elizabeth -- Grave Doubts \$26.99

 (Andrew Fenwick #2: Sgt. Nightingale has retreated to a remote family home to recover from her ordeal at the hands of a murderous rapist; a series of vicious murders in the vicinity makes DCI Fenwick wonder. Have they locked up the wrong man? And will Fenwick able to reach Nightingale before the killer does?)

- Costa, Shelley -- Basil Instinct \$7.99 (Eve Angelotta #2: PBO; When her grandmother Maria Pia is invited to join Belfiere, a secret Italian culinary society, Eve and her cousin Landon try to research the group, but all they can find is a warning in an old blog entry. Then Eve's new sous chef turns up dead inside the restaurant's front door and turns out to have connections to Belfiere. Can Eve and her crew solve the mystery before Maria Pia gets an offer she can't refuse?)
- Coulter, Catherine -- Bombshell \$9.99 (FBI Thriller #17: A frozen body left near the foot of the Lincoln Memorial ushers in a season of evil for FBI agents Dillon Savich and Lacey Sherlock.)
- Crockett, Jessie -- Maple Mayhem \$7.99
 (Sugar Grove #2: PBO; A saboteur is targeting supporters of Dani's syrup-producers cooperative. When a syrup maker is murdered, Dani must catch the killer before anyone else kicks the bucket.)
- Dionne, Erin -- Moxie and the Art of Rule

 Breaking \$6.99 (Edgar Award finalist. When she opens her front door to a mysterious stranger, suddenly Moxie is involved in Boston's biggest unsolved mystery: the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum art heist. Now she has two weeks to find the art, or she and the people she loves will be in big-time danger.)
- Dionne, Karen -- **Uncommon Denominator** \$7.99 (Killing #1: PBO; Novel based on the TV show. At a suspected meth explosion in a trailer

- park, firefighters discover a man's body with terrible head wounds. Then another man is discovered at the Port of Seattle, shot execution-style. Homicide detective Sarah Linden must unravel a web of addiction, greed, and betrayal to reveal the killer.)
- Disher, Garry -- Hell to Pay \$26.95 (Demoted from detective and posted to an isolated bush town, Constable Paul Hirschhausen discovers that the stagnant economy and entrenched racism and misogyny make every case a new basket of snakes. Now he must investigate the death of a teenage girl whose murder threatens to set the town ablaze.)
- Douglas, Carole Nelson -- Cat in an Alien X-Ray \$7.99 (Midnight Louie #25: An Area 51 attraction on the Las Vegas Strip threatens to bring more than starry-eyed UFO enthusiasts to town. It's up to feline PI Midnight Louie to keep his crew in line and save them from the attack of the creatures from the beyond or common criminals that prey on the innocent.)
- Eastman, Dawn -- Be Careful What You Witch For \$7.99 (Family Fortune #2: PBO; At Crystal Haven's Fall Festival, someone has decided to kill local witches. When the evidence points to ex-cop Clyde Fortune's best friend, Clyde sets out to catch a killer and save her pal.)
- Fiechter, J.J. -- A Masterpiece of Revenge \$14.95 (A model of probity, Charles Vermeille has the last word on 17th-century French artist Claude Lorrain's works; he determines which are authentic, which are fake. When Vermeille

- begins receiving photos of his adored son in the mail - no threats - he begins to suspect a connection to his appraisals. One of Lorrain's paintings, believed lost, has just miraculously turned up. Is someone forcing him to choose between his reputation and his son's life?)
- Force, Marie -- Fatal Flaw \$7.99 (Sam Holland #4: PBO; As her team investigates a series of baffling murders, Sam begins to suspect that she may be the ultimate prize in the killer's game.)

While Leaphorn fights for his life, Jim Chee leads the search for the shooter. As a witness, Bernie is officially banned from the investigation, but as she tries to track down Leaphorn's family and get in touch with his mysteriously absent partner Louisa, suspicious events draw her back into the case.)
- Houston, Victoria -- Dead Lil' Hustler \$16.99 (Loon Lake #14: It's mid-July, and Police Chief Lewellyn Ferris has her hands full: a murdered graduate student and the skeletal remains of a missing bank executive have been discovered on a hidden river deep in the national forest. - McAndrews, Jennifer -- Ill-Gotten Panes \$7.99 (Stained Glass #1: PBO; In the Hudson River hamlet of Wenwood, the locals are uneasy about having their brickworks turned into a tourist attraction. When someone opposed to the project winds up dead, Georgia Kelly must find the killer to clear her grandfather's name.)
- McCallin, Luke -- The Pale House \$16.00 (Gregor Reinhardt #2: While retreating with the rest of the Nazi army, intelligence officer Reinhardt witnesses a massacre of civilians, only to discover there is more to the incident than anyone believes. When five mutilated

- bodies turn up, his investigation begins to draw the attention of those in power.)

- Sakey, Marcus -- A Better World \$14.95 (Brilliants #2: For 30 years the world has struggled with a growing divide between the exceptional brilliants and the rest of us. Now a terrorist network led by brilliants has

- crippled three cities. Fanatics are burning people alive. As both a brilliant and an advisor to the US president, Nick Cooper is against everything the terrorists represent, but as the US slides toward civil war, Cooper is forced to play a game he dares not lose.)

 (Atlanta, 1974: A beloved cop has been gunned down, the police are out for blood, and the city is on the edge of war. When Maggie Lawson and her new partner, rookie Kate Murphy, are pushed out of the citywide search for the cop killer, they pursue their own line of inquiry.)
- Smith, Noble -- Spartans at the Gate \$25.99
 (Nikias #2: Hoping to hire an army of mercenaries to help defend his city from the coming Spartan assault, young Plataean warrior Nikias rides to Athens; there he encounters

- perils even more dangerous than those he faced in battle.)
- Snow, Robert L. -- Killers in the Family \$9.99 (PBO; Nonfiction. A family with dark secrets, the Reeses were responsible for a rash of home robberies and murders in Indianapolis.)
- Steinberg, Hank -- Out of Range \$9.99
 (Thriller Award finalist. Six years ago, journalist Charlie Davis nearly lost his life on assignment in Eastern Europe with his wife Julie. When she vanishes, Charlie becomes convinced there are things she has kept from him. His search for her leads him into a dangerous world of international espionage.)
- Stratmann, Linda -- An Appetite for Murder \$14.95 (Frances Doughty #4: Victorian London: The sudden death of overweight Thomas Whibley sparks a furor among diet doctors, vegetarians, and the Pure Food Society. Frances Doughty is hired to find the author of anonymous libels. A former colleague of Whibley's, Hubert Sweetman, who spent years in prison for a crime he claims he did not commit, also wants her to trace his estranged family. Before she can start, the police arrest him for the murder of his wife. Is Sweetman innocent? Where are his missing children? And who wielded the poisoned pen?)
- Tracy, Louis -- Number Seventeen \$14.95 (Reissue; Originally published in 1915. The writer in Flat 16 sees an older man pay a brief visit to Flat 17, home of a widow. The next day, when he learns the widow has been murdered, the writer becomes involved in the

investigation, teaming up with a bickering pair of detectives who are considerably more perceptive than they first seem.)

- Tremayne, Peter -- The Seventh Trumpet \$15.99 (Sister Fidelma #23: Ireland, 670: When the body of a murdered young noble is discovered not far from Cashel, the King calls upon his sister Fidelma and her companion Eadulf to investigate. The only clue to the dead man's identity is an emblem from a nearby kingdom. Could the murder be related to the wave of violence erupting in the western lands?)

- Box, C.J. -- **Shots Fired** \$26.95 (Collection. Suspense stories set in Wyoming, including 4 Joe Pickett stories.)
- Burke, James Lee -- Wayfaring Stranger \$27.99 (1934: A confrontation with Bonnie and Clyde

ends with young Weldon Holland putting a bullet through the rear window of their stolen car. 1944: Second Lieutenant Weldon Holland and Sergeant Hershel Pine survive the Battle of the Bulge, and find Rosita Lowenstein hiding in a deserted Nazi death camp. Eventually, Weldon and Rosita marry, and return to Texas along with Hershel. There, they enter the domain of jackals known as the oil business.  Lives \$24.99 (Dixie Hemingway #9: Dixie
 must solve a riddle of deception, revenge, and
 murder involving a car crash, a missing
 bookstore owner, and a crumbling mansion on the
 outskirts of town.)

- Cleverly, Barbara -- A Spider in the Cup \$15.95 (Joe Sandilands #11: 1933: A young woman's body is unearthed on the banks of the Thames, one toe missing and a priceless gold coin in her mouth. Soon they realize they might have got themselves tied up in a dog-fighting ring. With a little help from tabby cat Penny and Ginny's shar-pei Georgie, they have to figure out what's going on before someone else gets hurt.)
- Lancet, Barry -- **Japantown** \$15.99 (Jim Brodie #1: When an entire family is gunned down

in Japantown, the San Francisco Police
Department asks antiques dealer Jim Brodie, who
was raised in Japan, for help with the case.

centuries.)

- Lawson, Mike -- House Odds \$14.00 (Joe DeMarco #8: When Congressman Mahoney's daughter is arrested for insider trading, Joe DeMarco's job is to clear her name and keep his boss clean. But how did she get her hands on that much money to invest in the first place?)
- Loubiere, Sophie -- The Stone Boy \$15.00
 (After years in a convalescent home, Madame
 Preau returns to her house. The new neighbors
 have two healthy children who play in the yard.
 There is also a third child, who looks abused
 and tosses small stones at her window, but the
 family denies his existence. Is he real, or a

- Lovesey, Peter -- The Tooth Tattoo \$15.95 (Peter Diamond #13: Bath, England: A body is found in the city canal, and the only clue to the dead woman's identity is a musical note tattooed on her tooth. For Head of CID Peter Diamond, who wouldn't know a Stradivarius from a French horn, the investigation is his most demanding ever.)
- Lowry, Dave -- Chinese Cooking for Diamond
 Thieves \$13.95 (PBO; After getting kicked

out of college, Tucker gets a job at a Chinese restaurant, and woos waitress Corinne Chang. When Chinese gangsters show up demanding diamonds they believe she stole, Tucker and his friends have to figure out who's gunning for Corinne and how to stop them. Good thing Tucker is a Mandarin-speaking martial arts master who isn't afraid to throw the first punch.)

- Nair, Anita -- A Cut-Like Wound \$14.95 (Bhuvana is a hijra, a transgender seeking love in the bazaars of Bangalore. A passing man is attracted, but someone points out that Bhuvana is no woman. For that, the interloper's throat is cut - a case for Inspector Borei Gowda, who is at odds with his wife, his colleagues, and the informers he deals with.)
- Nesbo, Jo -- Police \$14.95 (Harry Hole #10: Oslo police officers are being slain at the scenes of crimes they once investigated but failed to solve. The police need Harry Hole, but with those he loves most facing terrible danger, Harry is not in a position to protect anyone . . . least of all himself.)
- Palahniuk, Chuck -- **Doomed** \$14.95 (Madison Spencer #2: Snarky dead girl Madison Spencer wanders Earth as a ghostly spirit, seeking her do-gooder celebrity parents and fighting the malign influence of Satan. She winds up on the new, totally plastic continent in the Pacific called Madlantis.)
- Pattison, Eliot -- Original Death \$15.95 (Duncan McCallum #3: 1760s Colonial America: Scottish exile Duncan McCallum and his

companion Conawago reach a little settlement of Christian Indians and find its residents ritually murdered. Conawago perceives the deaths as a sign of a terrible crisis in the spiritworld which he must resolve. Trying to make sense of the murders, Duncan is accused of the crimes by the British army.)

- Rosenfelt, David -- Hounded \$25.99 (Andy Carpenter #12: Andy's cop friend Pete Stanton summons him to a murder scene to take charge of the victim's basset hound and young son. When Pete becomes a suspect in the murder, he needs Andy to defend him, and to find out what really happened that day.)
- Rosenfelt, David -- **Dogtripping** \$15.99 (Nonfiction. Mystery writer Rosenfelt tells the story of moving his family - and their 25 rescue dogs - from Southern California to Maine.)
- Sandford, J/Cook, M -- Uncaged \$18.99
 (Singular Menace #1: YA; After 16-year-old Shay gets a frantic call from her brother, who escaped from a disastrous activist raid on Singular's research lab with flash drives and a post-surgical dog, she gets a menacing visit from Singular security. What Singular doesn't know yet is that Shay will burn Singular to the ground if that's what it takes to save her brother.)
- Silva, Daniel -- **The Heist** \$27.99 (Gabriel Allon #14: Art restorer and occasional spy Gabriel Allon searches for a stolen masterpiece by Caravaggio.)
- Stevens, Taylor -- **The Catch** \$24.00 (Vanessa Munroe #4: Munroe finds work as an interpreter for a maritime security company,

- only to discover she is now part of a gunrunning operation. When the ship is attacked by pirates off the Somali coast, Munroe escapes and takes the unconscious captain with her to get answers.)
- Triangle \$5.99 (Agatha: Girl of Mystery #6: PBO; Kids; When a priceless golden Mayan calendar goes missing, Agatha and her cousin Dash set out for the heart of the Bermuda Triangle.)
- Taylor, Patrick -- Now and in the Hour of Our

 Death \$24.99 (Davy MacCutcheon #2: 1983:
 Despite himself, former IRA bombmaker Davy
 McCutcheon is drawn into a conspiracy on behalf
 of his fellow Provos. Meanwhile, Fiona Kavanagh
 has made a new life for herself in Canada, but
 remains haunted by memories of her troubled
 homeland and of her lost love Davy.)
- Tremayne, Peter -- Atonement of Blood \$25.99 (Sister Fidelma #24: 670 CE: A winter feast is interrupted by the attempted assassination of King Colgu; Fidelma, Eadulf, and Gorman must discover who sent the killer.)

- Winter, Ariel -- The Falling Star \$7.99 (Twenty-Year Death #2: Published in HC as part of The Twenty-Year Death; 3 separate novels, each penned in the style of a different giant of the mystery genre, telling the story of an author whose life is shattered when violence and tragedy consume the people closest to him.

- 1941: A hardboiled private eye, hired to keep a movie studio's leading lady happy, uncovers the truth behind the brutal slaying of a Hollywood starlet.)
- Winter, Ariel -- Police at the Funeral \$7.99 (Twenty-Year Death #3: Published in HC as part of The Twenty-Year Death; 3 separate novels, each penned in the style of a different giant of the mystery genre, telling the story of an author whose life is shattered when violence and tragedy consume the people closest to him. 1951: A desperate man pursuing his last chance at redemption finds himself with blood on his hands and the police on his trail.)
- Winters, Ben H. -- World of Trouble \$14.95
 (Hank Palace #3: Detective Hank Palace has found sanctuary in the New England woods, in a well-stocked safe house with other onetime members of the Concord police. But with time ticking away before the doomsday asteroid makes landfall, Hank's safety is only relative, and his sister Nico isn't safe. Soon, it's clear that there's more than one earth-shattering revelation on the horizon, and it's up to Hank to solve the puzzle before time runs out for everyone.)
- Woods, Stuart -- Cut and Thrust \$26.95 (Stone Barrington #30: When Stone Barrington travels to Los Angeles for the biggest political convention of the year, amid the ambitious schemers and hangers-on are a few people who may use the chaos as cover for more sinister plans.)

than ever to see his vision of the world take hold.)

- Alexander, Tasha -- Behind the Shattered Glass (Lady Emily #8: Victorian England: The stately calm of life at Colin Hargreave's ancestral home is shattered when a neighbor bursts through the French doors and falls down dead. But who murdered the young aristocrat? The lovely cousin who was threatened by his engagement? The Oxford friend he falsely accused of cheating? The scheming vicar's daughter he shamelessly seduced? Or the relative no one knew existed who appeared to claim the title? And who was the woman seen walking with him moments before he was attacked? One family's hidden past and a forbidden passion are the clues to a puzzle only Lady Emily can solve.)
- Atkins, Ace -- The Forsaken \$26.95 (Quinn Colson #4: Decades ago, a nameless black man wandered into Jericho, Mississsippi, with nothing but the clothes on his back and a pair of paratrooper boots. He was accused of rape and murder, and lynched. Now evidence has surfaced of his innocence. Sheriff Colson sets out to identify the man's remains and charge those responsible for the lynching.)
- Baldacci, David -- King and Maxwell \$10.00 (King & Maxwell #6: Teenager Tyler Wingo asks Sean and Michelle to investigate his soldier father's death. He was reported killed in Afghanistan, but Tyler received a communication from him after his supposed death. The deeper

they dig, the more questions they uncover, until they realize they've stumbled into something that reaches into the highest levels of power.)

- Bannalec, Jean-Luc -- **Death in Pont-Aven** \$12.95 (George Dupin #1: Commissaire Dupin and his team investigate the murder of an elderly hotel manager in Pont Aven, Brittany; when further incidents muddy the waters, they uncover a web of secrecy and criminality that belies the village's idyllic image.)
- Barclay, Linwood -- No Safe House \$25.95 (Years ago, the Archer family barely survived a horrific ordeal. Now, unwillingly reconnected with the ruthless criminal who saved them then, they may have to do the unthinkable to survive.)

Jo and Zack are doing their best to keep their family safe, but when one of the principal players in the drama is murdered, events spiral out of control.)
- Bowen, Rhys -- Heirs and Graces \$7.99
 (Royal Spyness #7: Agatha Award finalist.
 Georgie is enlisted to help groom Jack
 Altringham, the Duke's newly discovered heir
 from the Australian Outback, for high society.
 Then the Duke announces he wants to choose his
 own heir, chaos ensues, and Jack's hunting
 knife finds its way into the Duke's back. But
 Georgie would bet the crown jewels that it
 wasn't Jack who put it there.)
- Bowen, Rhys -- Queen of Hearts \$25.95
 (Royal Spyness #8: On a voyage to America,
 Georgie's mother is offered a role by a
 Hollywood mogul, while Georgie and her beau
 Darcy investigate a suspected jewel thief. The
 trail leads to the mogul's Hollywood home where the mogul winds up dead.)
- Cameron, Christian -- **Destroyer of Cities** \$14.95 (Tyrant #5: Still smarting from his defeat at the hands of Ptolemy, Demetrius has his eye on one of the richest prizes in the

- ancient world, Rhodes. If she is to survive against such a merciless assault, Rhodes will need the help of every ally she can muster including Satyrus, the newly crowned King of the Bosporus, and his twin Melitta.)
- Carcaterra, Lorenzo -- The Wolf \$25.00 (Vincent Marelli runs the biggest criminal operation in the world. But he let his guard down, and now his wife and daughters are gone, murdered by terrorists with an ax to grind. So a war is what they'll get the full strength of international organized crime against every known terrorist group.)
- Carter, Stephen L. -- Back Channel \$27.95 (1962: As the Cuban missile crisis unfolds, circumstances leads to a young black woman, Cornell sophomore Margo Jensen, acting as back channel liaison between Soviet Premier Krushchev and US President Kennedy in desperate negotiations to avert nuclear war.)
- Casey, Elizabeth Lynn -- **Taken In** \$7.99 (Southern Sewing Circle #9: PBO; When a trip to the Big Apple ends in murder, the sewing circle searches for a killer who's rotten to the core.)
- Castle, Richard -- Storm Front \$9.99

 (Derrick Storm #1: High-level bankers are being gruesomely tortured and murdered. The killer, caught in a fleeting glimpse on a surveillance camera, has been described as a psychopath with an eye patch. And that means Gregor Volkov, Derrick Storm's old nemesis, has returned.

- Desperate to figure out who Volkov is working for and why, the CIA calls on Derrick Storm.)
- Challinor, C.S. -- Murder at Midnight \$14.99 (Rex Graves #6: PBO; An oncoming storm threatens a New Year's Eve party at a lodge in the Scottish Highlands. After the power goes out at the stroke of midnight, the lodge owners are found dead, and barrister Rex Graves must used his skills of detection to catch the culprit.)
- Chase, Erika -- Book Fair and Foul \$7.99

 (Ashton Corners #4: PBO; When an actual murder occurs during the Mystery Book Fair and Lizzie Turner is a suspect, the members of the book club rally to clear her name.)
- Cleeland, Anne -- Murder in Retribution \$24.00 (Sinclair & Doyle #2: As the Russian Mafiya and an Irish terrorist group battle for control of a lucrative business in London's criminal underworld, the body count climbs, and DCI Michael Sinclair and DC Kathleen Doyle struggle not to become the next victims.)
- Connelly, Michael -- City of Bones \$10.00 (Harry Bosch #8: Reissue; Edgar Award and CWA Gold Dagger finalist. A cold case stirs up memories of his childhood as an orphan for LAPD detective Harry Bosch. When the case takes a few hard turns, putting the city in an uproar, Bosch is driven to the brink of an unimaginable decision.)
- Coyle, Cleo -- Billionaire Blend \$7.99 (Coffeehouse #13: After a car bomb nearly kills

- a tech whiz billionaire, and Clare comes to his aid, he hires her to create the world's most expensive coffee blend. But lethal events continue to surround the mogul.)
- Craig, Elizabeth -- Shear Trouble \$7.99 (Southern Quilting #4: PBO; When Phyllis Stitt's ex-fiance turns up with her shears buried in his unfaithful heart, Beatrice must sharpen her sleuthing skills to find a killer before someone else's life is cut short.)
- Crane, Cheryl -- The Dead and the Beautiful \$7.99 (Nikki Harper #3: Dog walker Alison Sahira has been accused of murdering a client; she also has a dirty little secret that could derail a lot of Hollywood careers. Sure that Alison is innocent, Nikki must sort through lies and innuendo to find the truth.)
- Cumming, Charles -- A Colder War \$26.99

 (Tom Kell #2: When seemingly unrelated incidents the death or imprisonment of Turks and Iranians recently recruited by western intelligence agencies are followed by a senior agent's death in a puzzling plane crash, MI6 brings disgraced agent Tom Kell in from the cold to find the traitor responsible.)
- Daniel, Ray -- Terminated \$14.99 (Tucker #1: PBO; Six months ago, Boston software engineer Tucker's wife was murdered. Now his best friend Kevin, an agent in the FBI's cybercrimes division, has turned up a lead. When Kevin is murdered before his eyes, ubergeek Tucker is determined to track down the truth behind the killings.)

- de Giovanni, Maurizio -- By My Hand \$17.00 (Ricciardi #5: Naples, 1931: At their luxurious seaside apartment, a fascist militia officer has been stabbed over sixty times, and his wife's throat has been cut. A statue of the patron saint of workers lies in pieces on the floor. Commissario Ricciardi and Brigadier Maione must take to the city streets to uncover the truth.)
- Deaver, Jeffery -- The October List \$15.00 (Gabriela waits desperately for news of her daughter. At last, the door opens. But it's the kidnapper, and he has a gun. How did it come to this? Two days ago, Gabriela was told that her daughter had been taken, and was given an ultimatum: pay half a million dollars and find a mysterious document within 30 hours, or never see her child again.)
- Dees, Cindy -- Hot Intent \$7.99 (McCloud & Peters #2: PBO; Sent to Cuba to help care for hurricane survivors, translator Katie McCloud and her husband Dr. Alex Peters are thrust back into the thick of international espionage on opposite sides.)
- Delaney, Luke -- The Keeper \$9.99 (Sean Corrigan #2: When Louise Russell goes missing, DI Sean Corrigan has no doubts she was taken against her will, although he believes she's still alive. But time is running out: the body of a woman who's a dead ringer for Louise has been found dumped in the woods. How long before Louise's captor gets tired of her and replaces her?)

- Downie, Ruth -- Tabula Rasa \$26.00 (Ruso #6: Amid strife with the Britons, the Romans are building Hadrian's Great Wall, and Ruso and Tilla are helping care for the builders. First Ruso's clerk goes missing. Then the youngest son of a Briton family Tilla has befriended disappears. The search for answers leads Ruso and Tilla to an intricate scheme of slavery and changed identities.)
- Faye, Lyndsay -- Seven for a Secret \$16.00 (Timothy Wilde #2: Lucy Adams, a colored woman, comes to New York policeman Timothy Wilde for help. Her sister and nephew have been kidnapped, presumably by catchers, who snatch free colored people from the North, say they are captured slaves, and sell them in the South. As Timothy races to find Lucy's family, he finds a network of complicit judges and corrupt police.)
- Finch, Charles -- An Old Betrayal \$15.99
 (Charles Lenox #7: London, 1875: When a cryptic encounter with an old protege's client seems to lead, days later, to the murder of an innocuous country squire, Charles is drawn back into his old profession. He soon realizes that the dead man is only the first step in a cruel plot. With growing horror, Lenox learns that the killer may strike next at the very heart of England's monarchy.)
- Fluke, Joanne -- **The Other Child** \$7.99 (Reissue; Karen and Mike are excited about restoring their old mansion to its former glory. They didn't believe the rumors about the

- evil that lived there. It begins with a child's voice beckoning from the rose garden. It wants something from each member of the family.)
- Forsyth, Frederick -- The Kill List \$9.99 (A terrorist is radicalizing young Muslims to carry out assassinations. Unfortunately for him, one of the victims is a retired US Marine general, whose son is a top black-ops assassin.)
- Fraser, George MacDonald -- Quartered Safe Out
 Here \$14.95 (Reissue; Nonfiction. An
 action-packed memoir, offering a firsthand
 glimpse at the camaraderie, danger, and
 satisfactions of the nerve-racking frontline
 action he saw as a 19-year-old soldier during
 the British army's ferocious campaign against
 the Japanese in Burma during WWII.)
- George, Elizabeth -- Just One Evil Act \$17.00 (Lynley #18: Lynley and Havers investigate the disappearance of a little girl. The case turns out to be far more complex than a kidnapping, revealing secrets about the girl's mother and her new lover, and about the girl's father secrets Havers may not be willing to accept about her friend.)
- Glatt, John -- The Prince of Paradise \$7.99 (Nonfiction. Prosecutors suspect Narcy Novack of being involved in the death of her wealthy husband and his mother; Narcy's own daughter implicates her to the police.)
- Grafton, Sue -- W Is for Wasted \$7.99 (Kinsey Millhone #23: Kinsey uncovers a

- connection between two murders: a shady PI gunned down near the beach, and a man, probably homeless, found dead on the beach with Kinsey's name and phone number in his pocket.)
- Gregory, Susanna -- The Lost Abbot \$13.95
 (Matthew Bartholomew #19: 1358: A party of Bishop's Commissioners, including Matthew, must find out what has become of Peterborough's abbot, who went riding one day and hasn't been seen since. The poor of the town are being incited to rise up against their overlords, the abbey is at war with an army of mercenaries, and before long the woman in charge of a saint's tomb is murdered.)
- Grey, Mini -- Hermelin the Detective Mouse \$17.99 (Kids; Full color picture book. Hermelin can read books, and type notes, and solve mysteries. And the people of Offley Street need a detective! Again and again, Hermelin is on the case, the anonymous hero. But when his neighbors have a party in his honor and find out that Hermelin is a mouse, will he still be welcome?)
- Griffin/Butterworth -- Top Secret \$28.95 (Clandestine Ops #1: In the weeks after WWII, Lt. Cronley is recruited for a new enterprise. Another war has already begun, against a bigger, smarter, and more vicious enemy: the Soviet Union. Cronley's recruiter gives him 7 days to extract vital information from a Soviet agent.)
- Guinn, Jeff -- Manson: The Life and Times of Charles Manson \$17.00 (Nonfiction. A

definitive account of the life and criminal career of Charles Manson, filled with new information from interviews with relatives, childhood friends, cellmates, and even some members of the Manson 'family'. Includes previously unpublished photographs.)

- Guinn, Matthew -- The Resurrectionist \$14.95 (Edgar Award finalist. At South Carolina Medical College, Dr. Thacker's PR work for the dean takes a detour into the past when the bones of African-American slaves are unearthed on campus. In the 19th century, one of the school's founders purchased Nemo, a slave with unusual knife skills, who became an unacknowledged member of the surgical faculty by day, and a resurrectionist by night. Nemo would seize his self-respect in ways no one could anticipate.)
- Haddam, Jane -- Hearts of Sand \$7.99

 (Demarkian #28: 30 years ago, wealthy debutante Chapin Waring was revealed to be a bank robber and a murderer, and disappeared from her Connecticut beach town. When she's spotted in town, then turns up stabbed to death a day later, retired FBI profiler Gregor Demarkian is brought in to solve the decades of mysteries surrounding her.)
- Harris, Tessa -- The Lazarus Curse \$15.00 (Thomas Silkstone #4: PBO; 1780s: When the sole survivor of an ill-fated scientific expedition to Jamaica goes missing, anatomist Thomas Silkstone's investigation puts him on the trail of a drug that has the power to raise the dead,

- drawing him into a dangerous world of slavery, magic, and murder.)
- White Magic Five & Dime \$14.99 (Tarot #1: PBO; After inheriting the occult shop in tiny Berdache, Arizona, Alanis McLachlan decides to stay and take over the tarot-reading business in an attempt to find out who killed her con-artist mother.)
- Hooper, Kay -- Hostage \$9.99
 (Bishop/Special Crimes Unit #14: Haven operative Luther Brinkman and FBI agent Callie Davis are searching for an escaped felon in the Appalachian mountains. But as night falls, they discover they are the ones being hunted.)
- Jackson, Lisa -- Deserves to Die \$7.99

 (Montana #6: PBO; Struggling with a new commander and a department in upheaval, detectives Selena Alvarez and Regan Pescoli must find a killer intent on long-delayed vengeance.)
- Keeley, D.A. -- Bitter Crossing \$14.99

Westlake, Donald E. -- The Hot Rock \$14.95 (Dortmunder #1: Reissue; Edgar Award finalist. Dortmunder leaves prison with nothing to make money on but his good name. Luckily, his reputation goes far - no one plans a caper better. His friend tells him about a valuable emerald - it's not a simple heist, but after a

- few years inside, Dortmunder could use a challenge.)
- White, Randy Wayne -- Deceived \$9.99
 (Hannah Smith #2: A private museum, devoted to Florida's earliest settlers, has been announced, and Hannah's friends and neighbors in Sulfur Wells are being asked for donations. Problem is, it's a scam a front for a real estate power play that would wipe out the village, and the developers don't plan to let anything stand in their way.)
- White, Stephen -- Compound Fractures \$9.99
