Parking

Award News

The finalists for the Nebula Award for Best Novel are **The Goblin Emperor** by Katherine Addison aka Sarah Monette (\$8.99), **Trial by Fire** by Charles E. The nominees for the Hugo Award for Best Novel are **The Goblin Emperor** by Katherine Addison aka Sarah Monette (\$8.99), **The Dark Between the Stars** by Kevin J. Anderson (\$8.99), **Skin Game** by Jim Butcher (\$9.99), **Ancillary Sword** by Ann Leckie (\$16.00), and **The Three-Body Problem** by Cixin Liu, translated by Ken Liu (\$25.99).

Girl in the Road by Monica Byrne (\$15.00) and **My Real Children** by Jo Walton (\$25.99 hc, \$15.99 tr pb due mid-May) tied for the 2014 James Tiptree, Jr. Award, given for works that explore and expand gender roles.

Ancillary Sword by Ann Leckie (\$16.00) won the British Science Fiction Association Award for best novel.

The Edgar Allan Poe Award winners included Best Novel to **Mr. Mercedes** by Stephen King (\$16.00), Best First Novel by an American Author to **Dry Bones in the Valley** by Tom Bouman (\$14.95), Best Paperback Original to **The Secret History of Las Vegas** by Chris Abani (\$16.00), and Best Critical/Biographical to **Poe-Land: The Hallowed Haunts of Edgar Allan Poe** by J. W. Ocher (\$18.95).

The Agatha Award Winners included Best Contemporary Novel to **Truth Be Told** by Hank Phillippi Ryan (\$24.99), Best Historical Novel to **Queen of Hearts** by Rhys Bowen (\$25.95, \$7.99 paperback due early August), and Best First Novel to **Well Read, Then Dead** by Terrie Farley (\$7.99).

The nominees for the 2015 Thriller Awards for Best Novel are **The Fever** by Megan Abbott (\$15.00), **Broken Monsters** by Lauren Beukes (\$26.00, \$16.00 trade pb due mid-June), **Suspicion** by Joseph Finder (\$9.99), **Natchez Burning** by Greg Iles (\$27.99 signed hc or \$9.99 pb), and **That Night** by Chevy Stevens (\$15.99). The nominees for Best First Novel are **The Axeman's Jazz** by Ray Celestin (no U.S. edition yet), **Invisible City** by Julia Dahl (\$15.99), **The Life We Bury** by Allen Eskens (\$15.95), **The Weight of Blood** by Laura McHugh (\$16.00), and **The Martian** by Andy Weir (\$15.00).

How's Business by Don Blyly

Business continues to be up compared to last year, but still down compared to a few years ago. National Independent Bookstore Day on May 2 was reasonably successful at Uncle Hugo's (sales up about 50% from the first Saturday in May of last year), and I've heard that most other bookstores also experienced a large increase for the day. But most of our business on the day was regular customers coming in to make large purchases to get a free bookbag, rather than new customers discovering us for the first time. The local mass media seems to have pretty much ignored it. I know that MPR did a nice little article about it on their website, but I'm not aware of them discussing it on the radio. I didn't encounter any other local media coverage of the day, so most of the population had no idea it was happening.

I mentioned in the last newsletter that Borderlands Books of San Francisco had announced that they were going out of business because of the \$15 per hour minimum wage approved by San Francisco voters. They came up with a plan to stay in business. They offered sponsorships for \$100 each, and announced that if they sold 300 sponsorships by the end of March, they would stay open for the rest of 2015. Next year, they will also offer sponsorships, and if they sell enough by the end of March, 2016, they will stay open for the rest of 2016, and they will continue to sell annual sponsorships until either they don't sell enough sponsorships to cover the extra expenses or they have to close for some other reason. They sold enough sponsorships within 48 hours to be able to stay open for 2015.

Last newsletter I discussed some medical problems I had been experiencing. Since then, I had two more medical "adventures", totally unrelated to the ones I mentioned last time, but I now seem to be in good shape.

Short Recommendations by Don Blyly

The Rebirths of Tao (\$7.99) by Wesley Chu is the third in the series that began with **The Lives of Tao** (\$7.99) and was followed by **The Deaths of Tao** (\$7.99). The premise is that hundreds of millions of years ago a starship full of Quasings was damaged while passing through our solar system, and the only planet that could possibly support them was Earth. The Quasings could not survive on their own in Earth's atmosphere, but they could enter into a symbiotic relationship with the critters that had evolved on Earth. The Quasings have been guiding evolution on Earth ever since, trying to produce a race capable of building them a new starship so that they could continue their journey. A few centuries ago, the Quasings split into two groups. One group pushed for more wars to advance technology even faster, regardless of the cost to the humans; the other group had become fond of the humans and felt that after hundreds of millions of years working on the project, it wouldn't hurt to allow the humans an extra couple of centuries to get to the point where they could build the starship. The two groups of Quasings have been at war ever since, using the individual humans that they have symbiotic relationships with. Much of the story is told from the point of view of Tao and the various humans he has lived with and guided through the centuries. Tao is a member of the Prophus (friendly to humans) faction and has been fighting the schemes of the Genjix (stick it to the humans) faction. The Genjix have now come up with a new scheme. They think they have found a way to change the atmosphere of Earth so that the Quasings can survive on their own without the Earth critters, which is just as well, since the atmospheric changes will kill off all life that evolved on Earth. Tao and the rest of the Prophus faction are fighting this new plan, and even some of the Genjix faction think that their leadership is pushing forward with the new plan too quickly without enough testing to make sure that the Quasings will survive long term under the changed conditions. I'm looking forward to the next book in the series.

Wesley Chu has now started a new, totally unrelated science fiction series from a different publisher. **Time Salvager** (\$25.99, due early July) shows us a harsh 26th century, where Earth is in rough shape after the Third World War, the Earth Plague, and the AI War. Most of the human population has fled to the rest of the solar system, but things are tough there, too. ChronoCom has spent the last couple of centuries mining the past for resources, using a few highly trained chronmen who must obey strict rules to avoid setting up major ripples in the chronostream. Thus, things can be salvaged only shortly before they would have been destroyed by a historical event (just before a bomb strikes, just as a ship was sinking, etc.). James Griffin-Mars is a chronman near his breaking point, who takes one last dangerous mission to secure his retirement. He breaks the first of the Time Laws—he brings back a scientist from 2097 who was supposed to die in an explosion, making him and the scientist criminals subject to the death penalty. As he and the scientist flee ChronoCom, he learns how corrupt the system has become. Wesley Chu will be signing at Uncle Hugo's on Sunday, July 19, from 3 to 4 pm.

Cixin Liu is a top Chinese science fiction writer and **The Three-Body Problem** (\$25.99) was a best-selling Chinese novel. It has now been translated into English and the translation is on the ballot for best novel of 2014 for both the Nebula and Hugo Awards. The novel begins at the start of the Cultural Revolution in 1967 and explores the effect of the Cultural Revolution on Chinese society and especially on Chinese science. The Red Guard military set up a secret project which is supposedly aimed at spying on Russian and American satellites, but is actually intended to search for and then communicate with extra-terrestrial intelligent life. If there is intelligent life out there, the Red Guards want to control the flow of information between Earth and the aliens, and put the proper political spin on everything the aliens learn about Earth. I found the politics and the style of writing very interesting, more interesting than the science fiction element of the novel, and more interesting than most of the characters. I'll be waiting for the translations of the next two books of the trilogy.

Recently I was in the middle of 3 books but none were within reach when I had to grab something to read while standing in line to pick up lunch. I picked up a copy of Lisa Shearin's **Magic Lost, Trouble Found** (\$7.99) and it was so much fun that I went through all 6 books of the series before going back to any of the other 3 books I had abandoned. Raine Benares is an elf from a criminal family with moderate magical abilities in a world with elves, goblins, and humans being the primary races, although other races are mentioned. Raine uses her magical abilities as a "finder"—she can find lost (or stolen) objects and lost (or kidnapped) people, and usually her street smarts will keep her safe. Although Raine primarily stays on the right side of the law, her upbringing has given her a rather casual attitude about strictly obeying the law. When she finds a particular missing amulet, it tries to take possession of her, and soon evil goblin mages are after her. Over 6 books she has to deal with the evil mages, some pompous twits, some crooked politicians, an invasion of demons from hell, etc., often with help from various crooked family members. The entire series is a fun romp, with lots of attitude. The other books in the series are **Armed & Magical** (\$7.99), **The Trouble with Demons** (\$7.99), **Bewitched & Betrayed** (\$7.99), **Con & Conjure** (\$7.99), and **All Spell Breaks Loose** (\$7.99).

Bronze Gods (\$7.99) and the sequel **Silver Mirrors** (\$7.99) are by A. A. Aguirre (well-known author Ann Aguirre writing with her husband Andres). About a thousand years before the story begins, a chain of islands ruled by the fae were invaded by a fleet of ships full of humans with iron weapons that somehow slipped into the world. When it looked like the fae and the humans might kill each other off, a peace was negotiated that involved lots of inter-marriage between the fae and the humans. A thousand years later, the fae ruling houses are still rich and proud, but with a lot less magic than they once had. The population is mostly human without magic, but occasional limited magical abilities pop up among the general population. The technology has advanced over the last thousand years. The two main characters are a pair of police detectives. Janus Mikani is an honest cop, but a bit on the violent side, with a manner that is frequently irritating, and a bit of magical ability. Celeste Ritsuko is the only female detective on the force, very bright, and good at being diplomatic and at questioning witnesses. To everybody's surprise, they have become an excellent team, and the interaction between the two is delightful. There's lots of sleuthing in the first book, as they try to track down a serial killer who uses magic. There's very little sleuthing and lots of action in the second book, as they take on pirates and angry elementals.

Back in 2009, **Child of Fire** by Harry Connolly (\$7.99) came out. I started hearing good things about this new urban fantasy, tried it, and put it on the recommended fantasy shelf. Ray Lilly is a former car thief who becomes a "wooden man" for Annalise, a high-ranking member of the Twenty Palaces Society, a centuries-old organization of sorcerers devoted to hunting down and executing rogue magicians. It takes Ray a while to figure out that a "wooden man" is somebody openly displayed to the bad guys so that they will direct all their fire at the "wooden man" while the real threat sneaks up behind the bad guys. Once Ray learns that there are many dimensions full of predators looking for a way to get to Earth to consume all living beings, and that the rogue magicians are performing rites that open doorways that allow the predators onto Earth, he becomes committed to the cause even if nobody expects him to have a long career as a "wooden man".

In 2010 **Game of Cages** (\$7.99), the second of the series, came out. In 2011 **Circle of Enemies** (\$7.99), the third of the series came out. The entire series is wonderful, and has sold very well at Uncle Hugo's. (After over five years on the recommended fantasy shelf, **Child of Fire** managed to make it onto the bottom of our bestseller list for last month.) But people have been asking for years for the next volume. I recently learned that after the third book, the publisher decided not to buy any more books from Harry Connolly because they weren't satisfied with the sales of the first three books, and he had to self-publish **Twenty Palaces** (\$14.99), which is a prequel to the series. It begins the day Ray gets out of prison for his car theft activities, and covers his first experience with humans taken over by predators from another dimension, his first encounter with Annalise and other members of the Twenty Palaces Society, and explains how he got the "paper knife" that plays such an important role in the rest of the series. The book could have used a good copy editor (although the same can be said of many books from the major publishers, where running a manuscript through a spell checker seems to have replaced copy editing), but otherwise is a very good addition to the series.

Harry Connolly has also published a fantasy trilogy consisting of **The Way Into Chaos** (\$15.95), **The Way Into Magic** (\$13.95), and **The Way Into Darkness** (\$15.95). "The city of Peradain is the heart of an empire built with steel, spears, and monopoly on magic...until, in a single day, it falls, overthrown by a swarm of supernatural creatures of incredible power and ferocity. Neither soldier nor spell caster can stand against them." The series shows the collapse of the empire. I haven't read the series yet, but it's on my to-be-read list, and I've heard good comments about the series. (Publishers Weekly, after declaring **Child of Fire** one of the 100 best books published in 2009, gave **The Way Into Chaos** a starred review, referring to it as an "immersive, thrilling, and elf-free epic fantasy trilogy launch".)

Killing Pretty (\$25.99, due early August) is the seventh book in the Sandman Slim series by Richard Kadrey. You should start with the first book in the series, **Sandman Slim** (we still have a few copies left of the signed first mass market printing at \$7.99), and then go through the rest of the series before picking up **Killing Pretty**.

James Stark (also known as Sandman Slim) grew up in Los Angeles, was able to work magic, and joined a gang with some other magic users. The other gang members sent him to hell, where he spent eleven years as a gladiator for the amusement of the demons. Then he figured out how to escape from hell and went back to L.A. looking for payback against his former gang members. The first six books are sarcastic, irreverent, brutal, and hard-boiled, as Stark deals with the gang members, demons, zombies, vampires, twisted angels, twisted homeland security forces, old gods, etc., sometimes on Earth, sometimes in hell, sometimes in heaven. At the end of the sixth book, Stark saves the universe and can no longer hop off to hell or heaven whenever he wishes.

In **Killing Pretty**, Stark finally gets a job, working as a private investigator for a firm that specializes in supernatural cases. Suddenly, he has to show up for work on time, file reports and expense accounts, and try to stay sober while on duty. And everybody keeps telling him to tone down the violence. Stark keeps trying to act responsibly, but things

keep happening. And Death wants him to find out who tried to kill him—or at least tried to kill the body that Death is currently stuck in. To appreciate the almost responsible, less violent Stark of **Killing Pretty**, you have to be familiar with the totally irresponsible and hyper-violent Stark of the first six books.

Recommendations **by Elizabeth LaVelle**

I really enjoyed **The White Magic Five and Dime** (\$14.99) by Steve Hockensmith and Lisa Falco, so I was delighted to get my hands on an advance copy of the second book in the series, **Fool Me Once** (\$14.99, expected in August), which picks up right where the first book left off. Alanis is doing tarot readings and trying to make sure her sister does her homework and goes to bed on time, while hoping to identify more of her con-artist mother's victims so she can make amends to them. She has also helped her new friend Marsha Riggs leave her abusive husband. So when Bill Riggs is bludgeoned to death, and the Berdache cops decide that hapless, passive Marsha is the likeliest culprit, Alanis sets out to discover what really happened. Riggs was a belligerent, violent jerk, so there are plenty of other suspects. The fun comes from watching Alanis deploy her formidable con-artist skills while investigating, choosing a persona and creating a backstory that's just this side of outrageous. And she does her best to stay out of danger this time around (of course, not always successfully) and to keep her sister well clear of any not entirely legal activity. For backup, Alanis pairs up with Victor Castellanos, a thoroughly decent guy who seesaws between his growing attraction to Alanis and his dismay (or occasionally terror) at some of her behavior. She also partners reluctantly with Riggs' former jail mate G.W. Fletcher, a charmer with as many shady skills as Alanis. All of which makes for the same mix of absurd encounters and warm-hearted moments that I liked so much in the first book.

At 22, **Billy Boyle** (\$9.99, by James R. Benn) has just made detective, not because he's a great cop, but because he has family on the Promotions board. When the draft comes along, his family once again pulls strings to get him a safe stateside posting on his uncle's staff. But by June 1942, when Billy finishes his officer training, Uncle Ike (that's General Eisenhower to the rest of us) is based in London, in charge of the European Theater of Operations. And he's planning to have Billy investigate potentially delicate cases that might threaten Allied unity and military operations. Billy is determined not to let Uncle Ike down. His first assignment takes him to the Norwegian government-in-exile HQ in Sussex with his new boss Major Harding, a by-the-book career Army officer. Planning is underway for Operation Jupiter, the proposed Allied invasion of Norway, and Bill is tasked with identifying a spy among the Norwegian forces. Billy realizes he's way out of his depth; luckily, he will be ably assisted by Lt. Piotr Kazimierz, an expat Polish baron whose entire family was wiped out by Hitler. Kaz has an Oxford education and a facility for languages and codes that has earned him a place on the general's staff despite his bum heart. When one of King Haakon's top advisers dies in suspicious circumstances, they also have a murder to solve. Billy is a lively protagonist, very brash and gee-whiz, aware of his flaws and shortcomings but not inclined to fret over them. As an Irish-American from south Boston, he arrives in London ready to hate the British, a plan that does not survive his first encounter with working-class Brits at the local pub: they've already lost so many loved ones to the war, and they are so very glad that the US has joined the fight at last, they completely win Billy over. Kaz is also a great character, smart and witty, delighted to learn Southie slang from Billy, but with a core of sorrow from all that has befallen his country. The book also has plenty of action, both military and investigative.

Billy's adventures continue in November 1942 in **The First Wave** (\$14.00). Allied forces land near Algiers, naively expecting a quick takeover from the Vichy French. En route to arrange a surrender with a complicit faction of the French military, Billy and Major Harding instead find themselves captured by a vicious fascist militia run by the Vichy police. The militia has also rounded up the participants in the failed uprising, a group that includes Billy's girlfriend Diana, an English spy. Kaz and a team of Royal Commandos soon show up to rescue Billy and Harding, but by then the other captives have been moved to an unknown location. And the delicate politics of the situation make it impossible for the Allies to take any official action against the Vichy police or militia. A murder and theft at the newly set up Allied field hospital sends Billy on the hunt, officially for the hospital's desperately needed supply of penicillin, and unofficially for Diana, both stolen by a murderous Vichy police officer with ties to the Algerian underworld. But he still finds time to comment on Army food and procedures, to reflect on the changes the events of the war have wrought in Kaz, and to wonder what the Algerian natives think about the entire enterprise - whether it's France, Germany, Italy, or the US, their 'liberators' aren't planning to give the country back to its original owners. Much derring-do follows as Billy searches for the missing drugs, tries to figure out which members of the hospital staff collaborated in the crime, and works to locate and rescue Diana and if possible the other captives. The series continues with **Blood Alone** (\$14.00), **Evil for Evil** (\$15.95), **Rag and Bone** (\$14.00), **A Mortal Terror** (\$14.95), **Death's Door** (\$14.95), **A Blind Goddess** (\$15.95), and **The Rest Is Silence** (\$26.95 hc, \$15.95 trade pb expected in August).

Buy a Whisker (\$7.99) by Sophie Ryan is a great follow up to **The Whole Cat and Caboodle** (\$7.99). It's winter, and things have slowed down in North Harbor, Maine, aside from an occasional tour bus of Canadian skiers. So a proposed waterfront development that would increase tourism and bring more revenue to the area has local business owners thrilled - except for young bakery owner Lily Carter, and without Lily's property, the development can't go ahead. Sarah's shop isn't near the waterfront, so she's not directly involved, but several of her nearest and dearest have a stake in the matter. Quite a few folks in town are irate about Lily's stubbornness, there's been petty vandalism at her shop, and there are rumors that the developer might go broke if the plans don't proceed. So there's plenty for police detective Michelle Andrews and investigator Nick Elliot to look into when Lily is found dead. Despite the fact that the pros are doing their jobs well, there's no way Sarah will be able to stop 'Charlotte's Angels' once they decide to investigate. The most she can do is try to make sure her Gram's friends Charlotte, Rose, Liz, and geriatric hacker Arthur Peterson don't do anything dangerous. The mystery plot is nicely developed and convoluted, but for me the real enjoyment in this series is watching Sarah's family and friends as they work together, enjoy food together, head to the weekly jam session at their favorite local bar, and generally take good care of each other. It's also fun to watch the team at Second Chance bring new life to stuff that would otherwise end up in a landfill. And I really enjoy Sarah's discussions and arguments with her cat Elvis, and her reminiscences: what happened when Gram and her friends took thirteen-year-old Sarah and a friend to see Aerosmith (hint: it involves Steven Tyler and Rose); or how Sarah danced the Macarena with the skeleton in her high school biology class. The author does a great job of giving her characters breadth and depth and warmth, and the humor is always friendly. It's also great to read a cozy series where the police are capable, and people cooperate with them.

Elizabeth Peters is one of my all-time favorite authors, and one of very few that I can point to and say I'm a different person today because I read her books. At a time when most romance novels featured helpless and frequently clueless heroines in humorless peril, Peters' romantic suspense and mystery novels specialized in intelligent, independent women, attractive but aggravating men, entertaining supporting characters, plenty of humor (ranging from dry wit to sarcasm to slapstick), and smart plots. And I particularly love the Vicky Bliss series. First up is **Borrower of the Night** (\$9.99), published in 1973. A very tall, very intelligent blonde with the proportions of a Playboy bunny, Dr. Bliss struggles to be taken seriously as a historian in a world that believes anyone who looks like her must be an airhead. Landing a teaching position at a small Midwestern college, she meets Tony, who is tall, smart - and really fixated on getting married and having children, two things Vicky is entirely uninterested in. When Tony decides that the way to win her over is to prove he can dominate her intellectually, Vicky is flabbergasted. The two end up competing to see which of them can locate a lost masterpiece by a German artist who died in 1525. The search takes them to Germany, to a decrepit family castle turned hotel being run by Irma, the last of the Drachensteins (hello, petite brunette heiress in distress). Throw in Irma's decidedly nasty aunt, a rival treasure hunter from back home, a romantic rival for Tony, some mysterious ghostly happenings, a seance or two, and chubby old Professor Anton Schmidt (supposedly vacationing but often to be found in the thick of things), and you have all the trappings of a gothic romance. What you get is a lively story with plenty of twists (modern and historical), plenty of skulduggery (modern and historical), some deadly peril, and the indomitable Vicky (with some help from Tony) finally sorting the whole mess out.

Next in the series is **Street of the Five Moons** (\$9.99). Vicky is now working for Schmidt as an art historian at the National Museum in Munich. A man has turned up dead in an alley, in his pocket a spectacularly good forgery of a piece of antique jewelry in the museum's collection. Worried that there is a plan afoot to rob the museum by replacing original artworks with forgeries, Schmidt asks Vicky to figure out where the fake came from. A note in the dead man's pocket points to a street address in Rome, where Vicky finds an antique shop, and John Smythe (last seen in **The Camelot Caper**, \$9.99), an Englishman with flexible ethics and a number of criminal associates, some of whom are both unintelligent and unsavory. When they kidnap Vicky, John rescues her - an act of enlightened self-interest with perhaps a touch of chivalry on the side. He also warns her to stop investigating and head back to Munich. But Vicky figures out where they took her, and heads back into the fray. In John, Vicky has found an opponent worthy of her. He has a highly developed instinct for self-preservation, a pragmatic approach to most things, and no qualms about his criminal activities, although he abhors violence - particularly against him - and refuses to carry a gun, because the penalties are so much more severe. He's also handsome, intelligent, well-educated, and flippantly witty, with a sense of humor that gets him in trouble more than once. He's a very appealing rogue, and Vicky's dislike of his criminal activities doesn't entirely overcome her attraction to him. Nevertheless, she's determined to put a stop to the forgery gang - a task that turns out to be much trickier than she expected. Vicky and John's adventures continue in **Silhouette in Scarlet** (\$9.99), **Trojan Gold** (\$9.99), **Night Train to Memphis** (\$7.99), and **The Laughter of Dead Kings** (\$9.99).

Sweeney, Leann	The Cat, the Sneak and the Secret \$7.99 (Cats in Trouble #7: PBO; Tom's stepson Finn has fallen for a cat from the animal sanctuary, and Jillian and Tom readily agree to make room. When the kleptomaniac kitty brings home an antique locket, Finn turns to Tom and Jillian for help finding the owner. Their search is sidetracked when they find a dead body.)
Tremayne, Peter	The Devil's Seal \$26.99 (Sister Fidelma #25: An Anglo-Saxon delegation has arrived in Cashel to debate the new religious rules from Rome with an Irish delegation. When the debate turns acrimonious, the local abbess steps in to mediate. When she is found bludgeoned to death, Fidelma and her companion Eadulf investigate.)
Vallere, Diane	Crushed Velvet \$7.99 (Material Witness #2: PBO; A fabric delivery isn't quite what Poly expected: crushed under a dozen bolts of fabric is Phil Girard. When his wife, Poly's friend Genevieve, becomes prime suspect, can Poly track down the real killer?)
Waite, Urban	Sometimes the Wolf \$14.99 (Sheriff Patrick Drake was hit with money troubles, fell in with some unsavory men, and ended up convicted of one of the biggest crimes in local history. 12 years later, Patrick is on parole under the watchful eye of his son Bobby, a deputy sheriff. But a threat boils up from Patrick's old life - and this time, no one will be spared.)
White, Randy Wayne	Haunted \$9.99 (Hannah Smith #3: A historic, supposedly haunted, house is due to be razed and replaced by condos. A wealthy Palm Beach woman hires Hannah to prove that the seller didn't disclose everything he knew about the house when he unloaded it.)

Batacan, F.H.	Smaller and Smaller Circles \$26.95 (Quezon City, Philippines, 1997: The police are devoid of resources and rife with corruption, so when eviscerated bodies begin to appear at the local dump in a poor neighborhood, two Jesuit priests dedicate themselves to tracking down the monster responsible.)
Bauer, Belinda	Rubbernecker \$24.00 (Gold Dagger shortlist, best novel. Patrick Fort, a medical student with Asperger's, finds the body he is examining in anatomy class is trying to tell him all kinds of things. But no one else hears what he does. Can he solve a murder when no one else believes a crime has taken place?)
Bell, Gertrude	A Woman in Arabia: The Writings of the Queen of the Desert \$17.00 (Gertrude Bell turned her back on Victorian society to study at Oxford and travel the world. Mountaineer, archaeologist, Arabist, writer, poet, linguist, and spy, she championed the Arab cause, and became chief architect of British policy in the Middle East after World War I. This volume brings together her letters, military dispatches, diary entries, and travel writing.)
Butler, Dori Hillestad	The Secret Room \$4.99 (Haunted Library #5: Ages 6 and up. Now that Kaz can finally pass through walls without feeling all 'skizzy', he can go explore Beckett's secret room at the back of the library. What he finds there is a mystery he never expected.)
Carlson, Caroline	The Terror of the Southlands \$6.99 (Very Nearly Honorable League of Pirates #2: Ages 8 and up. Despite Hilary's magical know-how and daring, the VNHL is not convinced she is worthy to be the Terror of the Southlands. When Miss Pimm disappears, Hilary and her crew set off on a high seas adventure to find the missing Enchantress and protect Augusta's magic.)
Challinor, C.S.	Murder Comes Calling \$14.99 (Rex Graves #7: PBO; Four deaths in a secluded English community, linked by the fact that their homes were up for sale, lead the police

	to arrest a shady house agent, but Scottish barrister Rex Graves digs into the victims' pasts and learns that they were not who they appeared to be.)
Chisholm, P.F.	A Chorus of Innocents \$15.95 (Sir Robert Carey #7: 1592: Back in Carlisle, courtier Sir Robert Carey and his henchman Henry Dodd investigate when a very pregnant young woman rides to Lady Widdrington's tower, crying that her clergyman husband has been murdered and she has been raped.)
Crider, Bill	Between the Living and the Dead \$24.99 (Dan Rhodes #22: Summoned to investigate gunshots at a haunted house, Texas sheriff Dan Rhodes finds the body of a meth dealer. The case is complicated by a paranormal investigator, who wants to solve the crime by communing with the dead man's ghost - but communes with someone else instead, leading to the discovery of a second body.)
Dunbar-Ortiz, Roxanne	An Indigenous Peoples' History of the United States \$16.95 (Nonfiction. Historian and activist Dunbar-Ortiz offers a history of the US, revealing how the Indigenous peoples actively resisted expansion of the US empire, and how US policy was designed to seize territory by displacing or eliminating them.)
Evans, Mary Anna	Isolation \$15.95 (Faye Longchamp #9: As Faye struggles to recover from a shattering personal loss, crimes against women rock Micco County. Joe Wolf Mantooth realizes that his wife is in danger from her inner demons - and from an outside evil that they can only fight if they work together.)
Grisham, John	Gray Mountain \$9.99 (2008: Two weeks after losing her job at NYC's largest law firm, Samantha is working at a legal aid clinic in a small Appalachian town, dealing with clients with real problems - and stumbling across secrets that should have remained buried in the mountains forever.)
Hiaasen, Carl	Skink No Surrender \$10.99 (Ages 10 and up. To avoid being shipped off to boarding school, Malley takes off with some guy she met online. Richard knows his cousin's in trouble before she does, and teams up with Skink, the renegade one-eyed ex-governor of Florida, to track her down.)
Hilary, Sarah	No Other Darkness \$16.00 (Marnie Rome #2: DI Marnie Rome and DS Noah Jake investigate when two dead boys are discovered in a bunker beneath a London garden.)
Hockensmith, S/Falco, L	Fool Me Once \$14.99 (Tarot #2: PBO; Alanis is keeping busy, carrying on her mom's tarot reading business (minus the scams), and trying to make sure her half-sister Clarice does her homework. But when Marsha Riggs' abusive husband is found bludgeoned to death and Berdache's newest detective arrests Marsha, Alanis figures it's up to her to find out who really did the deed.)
Kellerman, Jonathan	The Murderer's Daughter \$28.00 (Psychologist Grace Blades has a gift for treating troubled souls and tormented psyches, in part because as a child she witnessed her parents' murder-suicide deaths. She took refuge in her intellect and found comfort with the loving couple who adopted her, but she still has a dark side. When her two worlds converge, her harrowing past returns with a vengeance.)
Kellough, Janet	The Burying Ground \$11.99 (Thaddeus Lewis #3: Toronto, 1851: Who is digging up graves at the Strangers' Burying Ground, final resting place of criminals, vagrants, and indigents? The authorities are unconcerned, so sexton Morgan Spicer turns to his friend Thaddeus Lewis for help.)
Lee, J.M. (Jung-Myung)	The Investigation \$24.95 (Korea, 1944: As young prison guard Watanbe Yuichi investigates the murder of another guard, he begins to discover what is really going on inside this violent institution which few inmates survive - and becomes determined to protect a poet whose works hold great beauty.)
Lovegrove, James	The Thinking Engine \$14.95 (Sherlock Holmes: PBO; Oxford, 1895: Professor Quantock claims his new computational device is capable of analytical thought to rival that of the cleverest men. A battle of wits ensues as Holmes and his mechanical counterpart compete to be first to solve a series of crimes.)
Maron, Margaret	Long Upon the Land \$27.00 (Deborah Knott #20: When Judge Deborah Knott's father Kezzie finds a dead man on a remote corner of his farm, the investigation uncovers long-simmering hostility between the two men. After the local newspaper implies her family might be involved in the killing, and that her deputy husband is dragging his feet on the case, Deborah sets out to find answers.)
Ostlundh, Hakan	The Intruder \$26.99 (Fredrik Broman #5: When a family is sent frightening anonymous letters, Gotland policeman Fredrik Broman and his colleagues investigate, but can't rule out the possibility of a prankster. But when the threats escalate and the family's daughter disappears, all doubts vanish.)
Pulixi, Piergiorgio	The Night of the Panthers \$17.00 (Biagio Mazzeo #2: Inspector Mazzeo heads a

	special unit that investigates organized crime, often leading them well beyond the confines of what is legal. Now they've been found out. Plus the unit has stolen a shipment of drugs, and the cartel wants it back.)
Rankin, Ian	The Beat Goes On \$26.00 (John Rebus: Collection. All the stories featuring the Scottish detective, including previously unpublished works.)
Rimington, Stella	Close Call \$17.00 (Liz Carlyle #8: Are the weapons for arms deals in Yemen coming from a connection in the UK? Liz Carlyle and her counter-espionage colleagues investigate.)
Robinson, Peter	In the Dark Places \$25.99 (Alan Banks #22: DCI Alan Banks and his team investigate the disappearance of two young men; the inquiry takes a darker turn when, in the wreckage of a crashed truck, they find a body that was dead well before the crash.)
Smith, Dan	Red Winter \$14.95 (Central Russia, 1920: Deserting his Red Army unit, Kolya returns home only to find the village empty, the men massacred in the forest and the women and children missing. He sets out on a desperate winter journey to find them, but there are dark things in his past, and someone - or something - is following his trail.)
Sprigg, Christopher	Death of an Airman \$12.95 (Reissue; Originally published in 1934. On leave in England, Australian bishop Edwin Marriot is learning how to fly. When an aeroplane crashes, killing its pilot, Marriot is not convinced it was an accident, and teams up with Inspector Bray of Scotland Yard to investigate.)
Syken, Bill	Hangman's Game \$25.99 (After losing his starting quarterback position to a shoulder injury, Nick Gallow remade himself as a punter. After he witnesses the murder of the team's new all-star draft pick, he has no plans to get involved - until the police go after the wrong man.)
Todd, Charles	A Pattern of Lies \$25.99 (Bess Crawford #7: 1918: An explosion at the Ashton Gunpowder Mill has killed over a hundred workers. When suspicion and rumor lead to the persecution of the Ashton family, Bess follows the only known witness to the Front in France in hopes of learning the truth.)
Walker, Martin	The Patriarch (UK title: The Dying Season) \$24.95 (Bruno #8: Bruno is delighted to attend a WWII flying ace's birthday celebration, but it becomes another day on the job when a friend of the family ends up dead. All signs point to a tragic accident, but Bruno isn't so sure.)
