Holiday Gift Ideas

Our most popular gift option continues to be our gift certificate. We can issue one for any amount. It can be used at either or both Uncles. It can even be used for mail orders, and it can be purchased over the phone (if you have a Visa, Mastercard, or Discover Card) and we can mail it

either to the purchaser or to the recipient, or we can just enter the balance on a credit file here in the store to avoid the risk of the gift certificate being lost.

Calendars used to be a very popular gift item, but so many people are now using assorted electrical devices in place of a wall calendar that we substantially reduced our selection of calendars last year. Then our primary supplier of calendars really screwed us over last year, so we are not carrying calendars this year. We have special ordered calendars for a few people this year.

We also have lots of signed books, art books, and humor books, including some that can be given to people who don't read sf or mysteries.

How's Business by Don Blyly

We discovered in late September that we had a problem with our shopping basket. I received emails from a couple of customers asking why they hadn't yet received their orders place on our shopping basket. I found that we had not received either order, and when I went to the secure website to try to find the orders I discovered that we had only received 3 orders for the entire month of September and no orders since September 6. We sometimes receive over 100 orders per month and always receive several dozen orders per month, so something was clearly wrong. I went to our shopping basket and placed

a test order. The order was accepted, but not passed along to the store.

Here's the way the shopping basket has worked for the last 8 years. We pay a large company with lots of experience with computer security issues to host our shopping basket, paying them an annual fee for the service. They provide a basic shopping basket function, with some opportunities for the various merchants to do a bit of personalization to meet the needs of the particular merchant. A customer places an order, including credit card information. The large company then sends an e-mail to Uncle Hugo's to announce that a new order has come in. This email has all the information except the credit card information, and we get one e-mail for each order placed (sometime 30 or 40 in a single day, if we've just announced the opportunity to preorder a personalized signed book by a major author). I then have to go to a secured website to get the full information about the order, which does include the credit card information. If everything on the order is already in stock, the order gets packed within 24 hours, and the charge is made when the order is ready to ship. But things are seldom that easy. Often, the order includes books that are not yet published. But we never run the charge until the shipment is ready to ship, for many reasons. Some customers order 3 months of forthcoming books at once, and say "send all the September titles in one shipment, send all the October titles in a second shipment, and send all the November titles in a third shipment". Sometimes the

publishers change the price of the book after we've ordered it. Sometimes books don't come out when expected. (We are still holding an order for a title announced for Spring, 2015 by a small publisher, who now claims it will be out sometime in 2017, which is about the 10th time he has announce a new date for the book.) Sometimes a customer asks us to substitute used books if available, but the shopping basket order only shows the price of new books. And then there is the shipping charge. We charge a flat \$6.00 charge for media mail to a U.S. address, regardless of the size of the order. On rare occasions, somebody insists on UPS instead of post office. For Alaska and Hawaii, media mail is so slow that some customers prefer priority mail. And international shipping gets very expensive and somewhat complex, and we need to have the books in hand to be able quote how much shipping is going to cost. And then there is the matter of sales tax, which is a complex mess in Minnesota. We have to charge sales tax on both the books and the shipping for books shipped within Minnesota, but the sales tax is different for Minneapolis (where we get hit with almost every sales tax under the sun, except for a few that only apply within downtown Minneapolis) than for St. Louis Park (where they don't have to pay the Vikings tax) or St. Paul (where they don't have to pay either the Vikings tax or the Twins tax) or Mankato (where they don't have to pay the Vikings tax, the Twins tax, or the metro transit tax). The shopping basket adds the Minneapolis sales tax to orders within Minnesota, but I then adjust the sales

tax downward for those outside Minneapolis, figuring that people won't be upset if they end up paying a few cents less than expected.

The hosting company we started using 8 years ago had a very high ranking when we started doing business with them, but now has a "mediocre" rating. The company was purchased by a much larger company, which decided to change all the rules in September. They stopped sending us emails when a new order is placed. (Not too hard to deal with-I now go to the secure site a couple times per day to see what orders have come in.) They changed to a different secured site that we need to visit to get the orders, without bothering to let us know about this change. When I finally got ahold of a customer service person, he claimed that it was impossible to let us know about the change to a different site to print out our orders because they didn't have our e-mail address-even though the company used to send us up to 30 e-mails per day. We managed to get all of the orders that were placed after September 6. But we've since found other changes that were made to our customized shopping basket. They removed the buttons for "do you want us to substitute used books when available" and for "should we send in 2 or 3 shipments, or hold the order until everything arrives?" (We don't miss the second button much, because about half of the people who ordered a single book then told us to send the single book in 2 or 3 shipments.) They wiped out the box for "special instructions for this order". They instead put in a box for "comments

on this order"-but when we retrieve the order, they don't pass along what was placed in the "comments on this order" box. To say that we are displeased would be a significant understatement.

We started looking for somebody else to host our shopping basket, and found that things have changed a lot in the past 8 years. We would have to completely redesign our website to switch to a new hosting company, and we don't currently have the time to do that or the money to hire somebody to do it for us. (I recently read that Poisoned Pen Bookstore just paid \$90,000 to redesign their website to make ordering easier.) The hot new thing in e-commerce seems to be for a person to set up a website to sell stuff the person doesn't actually possess, but they have a contract with somebody else to drop ship the products to the customers. So, the hosting company takes the order, takes the payment immediately, passes the order along to the drop shipper, and the person who owns the website gets a piece of the action while building his next website(s). This model does not fit well with us, where we own the books, ship the books ourselves, and we don't want the payment processed until we are ready to ship the order.

We recently received a presentation from Dex Media on website redesign. (It was supposed to be a meeting to approve our yellow pages ad for the next year, but turned out to be much more ambitious.) They wanted us to pay them to redesign and host our website, and they were full of ideas we didn't like. For example, they wanted to change the website so that a potential customer had to provide their phone number and e-mail address just to take a look at our website, so that we could then bury the potential customer with future advertising (with the help of Dex), and they assured us that most websites are going to this model (which I hope is not true). They also wanted to tie their redesign of our website to a new shopping basket hosting service that they are offering with PayPal, where only PayPal can be used for taking payment.

We are reluctantly sticking with our current shopping basket until we can find a better option. If you want us to do anything special (like substituting used books, sending the order in more than one shipment, asking an author to personalize a signed book for you, etc.), we can still do those things, but you should send a separate e-mail directly to UncleHugo@aol.com with your special requests. I've heard from a couple of people who thought that they had to set up an account with a password in order to place an order at the shopping basket. That is not the case. If you just want to place an order, just place the order. If you want to be able to go back to the shopping basket later to see what you ordered in the past, then you have to set up an account with a password-or you can just drop an e-mail directly to Uncle Hugo and ask.

I recently read an article about prisons banning books, some for understandable reasons. But the Texas Department of Criminal Justice has really gone crazy, banning about 11,000 books, including For Love of Evil by Piers Anthony, Enchantment by Orson Scott Card, The Last Hero by Terry Pratchett, The Witching Hour by Anne Rice, and Deadeye Dick by Kurt Vonnegut. We've been sending books to prisons for decades, sometimes paid for by relatives of inmates, sometimes paid for by the inmates. We also used to sell books to prison libraries, but the money for that seems to have dried up a few years ago. We've never run into a "banned book" problem, but each prison has its own rules for what it allows to come in: some won't allow used books to come in, some will only allow used books to come in if the book is no longer in print (I wonder how the prison quards determine this), and some consider used books just fine. The prison libraries certainly liked used bookstwice as many books for their very limited budgets. Some prisons limit how many books can come in at once, some limit how many books an inmate can have in his cell. Most prisons only allow books to come in if they are mailed directly from a bookstore with the receipt enclosed. They probably found that if friends of inmates could send in books, some of the books were hollowed out to contain contraband.

California has passed a new law that was supposed to address the problem of fake signatures on sports memorabilia, but the law went way overboard. The new law applies to ALL

autographed items sold for \$5 or more. Any such autographed item must come with a certificate of authenticity (COA). The COA must include lots of information about the dealer, whether or not the item was autographed in the presence of the dealer, specify the date that the item was autographed, and provide the name of a witness to the autographing. If the item was already signed when the dealer purchased the item (such as from a publisher or from a customer selling his collection), the COA must also contain the name and address of the previous owner. If a dealer sells an autographed item without a COA or provides a false one, the law provides a penalty equal to 10 times actual damages, plus court costs, reasonable attorney fees, interest, expert witness fees, and allows the court to add on additional damages. Booksellers are very concerned about this. Used book fairs and auction houses in California are finding that very few dealers are willing to risk selling autographed books in California until the law gets fixed. There is also a question regarding artwork. If the artist signs a painting, is the autograph an autograph under the law, requiring a COA (with the date the artist signed the painting and the name of a witness to the signing, etc.) or is it merely part of the painting?

We sell a fair number of signed books to people who live in California. Some are bought from the publishers already signed. Some were signed at signing events at the Uncles over the years, so that it might be possible to look at old

newsletters and determine when the book was signed (but not to come up with names of witnesses). Many were signed over the years at "drive-by signings", where the author was in town for a day and dropped into a bunch of bookstores to sign stock, and it would be impossible to come up with the date. It would be impossible to match up used signed books with the customers we bought them from. We'll continue to fill orders for signed books from California until we see if the state goes after any bookstores for selling signed books. If that happens, we'll stop filling orders for signed books from California until the law gets fixed.

Since we moved to this location in 1984, Fall has been marked by three events. (1) Crickets invade the store, hide under the book cases, and drive us crazy with their chirping. (2) Yellow jackets swarm around the trash dumpster behind the building. (3) Huge swarms of box elder beetles cover the back wall of the store for a few days. None of these events have happened this year, and I don't know if I should celebrate or be worried.

Short Recommendations by Don Blyly

Last issue I recommended Just One Damned Thing After Another by Jodi Taylor (\$12.99), the first of the seven-volume British madcap time travel series The Chronicles of St. Mary's. I've now read the second (A Symphony of Echoes, \$12.99) and the third (A Second Chance, \$12.95). And

they continue to be delightful. Each starts with "Dramatis Thingummy", a guide to the characters, with descriptions like:

Professor Andrew Rapson: Head of R&D. Should not be allowed to play with matches.

Doctor Octavius Dowson: Librarian, Archivist, and matches-hider.

9 lb Double Gloucester Cheese: An instrument if not of death, certainly of major concussion. The third volume includes visits to Isaac Newton, the Trojan War, the Battle of Agincourt, and the early years of the Gloucester tradition of chasing round cheeses down a steep hill

Steven Erikson is primarily known for his huge, grim, complex, excellent fantasy novels in the Malazan Book of the Fallen series. Willful Child (\$8.99) is totally different. It's only about 1/4 the size of his fantasy novels, and is humorous space opera. Imagine Captain Kirk at his most macho, narcissistic and misogynistic, cranked up by about a factor of 10, done for laughs, and you'll have a good idea of what this book is like. If you enjoyed Redshirts by John Scalzi (\$15.99), you'll probably like Willful Child. But I've talked to some people who couldn't finish it. The sequel, Willful Child: Wrath of Betty (\$25.99) just arrived.

This Gulf of Time and Stars by Julie E. Czerneda (\$7.99) is the seventh book about the Clan, a race that can pass for human but are not. It is very good, but you should read the earlier books first. The first trilogy written was the Trade Pact, consists of A Thousand Words for Stranger

(\$7.99), Ties of Power (\$7.99), and To Trade the Stars (\$7.99). The Trade Pact is a segment of the galaxy full of intelligent races, including humans. I've recommended this series to many people over the last 19 years, especially to people who enjoy Sharon Lee and Steve Miller's Liaden Universe series. Later, Czerneda wrote a prequel trilogy, Stratification, consisting of Reap the Wild Wind (\$7.99), Riders of the Storm (\$7.99), and **Rift in the Sky** (\$7.99), telling the story of where the Clan came from, the planet Cersi, where three very different sentient species co-exist, and telling why and how they fled to the Trade Pact part of the galaxy. The first half of This Gulf of Time and Stars takes place within the Trade Pact, as the Clan is being hunted down and killed. The survivors are searching for a way to escape back to where they came from, without a clear idea where that was or how to get there. The second half of the book follows the survivors as they get back to Cersi, meeting with members of the Clan who did not flee and trying to understand the background of the Clan. The next book in the series, The Gate to Futures Past (\$26.00), arrived a couple of months ago, but I haven't had a chance to read it yet. The Clan and the planet Cersi were an experiment set up long ago by the legendary vanished high tech civilization of the Hoveny, and the characters from This Gulf of Time and Stars go searching for the home of the Hoveny and some answers.

Poseidon's Wake by Alastair Reynolds (\$9.99) is the third in the big universe space opera series

that began with **Blue Remembered Earth** (\$8.99) and continued with On the Steel Breeze (\$8.99). The first book begins about 150 years in the future, with Africa as the world's dominant technological and economic power, and mankind spread across most of the solar system. Eunice Akinya was a space explorer, inventor, and entrepreneur, but exploration was what really motivated her. Most of her descendants are happy to run the business empire she created and rake in the money, but a few of her descendants are interested in things other than wealth. Cranky old Eunice (in various forms) and her descendants are the common thread through the trilogy. The second book deals with generation ships to colonize other planets, genetic manipulation to uplift elephants to human level intelligence, humans becoming merpeople and other ocean-dwelling beings, human-developed artificial intelligences, hostile alien artificial intelligences, cloning, and many other technological wonders. In Poseidon's Wake, the colony planet Crucible receives a cryptic message from Gliese 163, seventy light-years away, requesting that Nnege Akinya come. Crucible was building a couple of generation ships and sends one of the ships to investigate the source of the signal, but Nnege is too old to survive the trip. Her daughter Goma, a biologist, and her brother Mposi, a government official, join the crew. In the solar system, Kanu Akinya is the merman ambassador to Mars, where the artificial intelligences have taken over and banned human colonization. The Martian AIs have learned somehow of this cryptic

message, and soon Kanu is also on his way to Gliese 163. When the Akinyas gather at Gliese 163 they have to deal with Poseidon, a planet created by an ancient alien race, which will only allow living beings to visit, and has been destroying all AIs that try to visit the planet for millions of years.

- Lee, Amanda -- Better Off Thread \$7.99 (Embroidery #10: PBO; Marcy agrees to be one of Santa's elves at the local hospital, which puts her right on the spot when an unpopular administrator is murdered.)
- Lemaitre, Pierre -- The Great Swindle \$14.99
 (International Dagger winner. October 1918: The war is almost over. Desperate for promotion,
 Lt. Pradelle sends two scouts out, then surreptitiously shoots them to incite his forces to heroic action. This sets in motion events that bind together the fates of Pradelle and of two soldiers who discover his crime.)
- LoTempio, T.C. -- Crime and Catnip \$7.99 (Nick & Nora #3: PBO; While catering a gala for a museum, Nora agrees to look into the disappearance of the director's niece.)

- Marsh, Ngaio -- Last Ditch \$14.95 (Roderick Alleyn #29: Reissue; Ricky Alleyn, now 21, has relocated to a secluded island to write a novel. When he stumbles across a murder and then gets himself kidnapped, Inspector Alleyn heads to the island to get to the bottom of things.)
- Marsh, Ngaio -- A Grave Mistake \$14.95 (Roderick Alleyn #30: Reissue; Exhausted from the stresses of family life, wealthy Sybil Foster heads to a local hotel that specializes in soothing shattered nerves. When she's killed, Inspector Alleyn has a real puzzler on his hands.)
- Marsh, Ngaio -- Photo Finish \$14.95 (Roderick Alleyn #31: Reissue; On a visit to a lavish island estate in New Zealand, Inspector Alleyn winds up investigating when a diva is murdered. Soprano Isabella Sommita was widely loathed, and Alleyn finds himself with an abundance of suspects.)
- Maxwell, Alyssa -- Murder Most Malicious \$15.00 (Renshaw & Huntford #1: 1918: The peace of Foxwood Hall is shattered on Boxing Day, when a houseguest goes missing. Not entirely missing, though - macabre evidence of foul play turns up in gift boxes given to a handful of servants. The local constable suspects a footman, but Lady Phoebe Renshaw and her maid Eva Huntford follow the clues in a different direction.)
- McDermid, Val -- Out of Bounds \$25.00 (Karen Pirie #3: When a teenage joyrider ends

- up in a coma, a DNA test reveals a connection to an unsolved murder from 22 years ago. As detective Karen Pirie investigates, she also finds herself drawn to another mystery she has no business investigating, rooted in a terrorist bombing two decades earlier.)
- McMahon, Jennifer -- Promise Not to Tell \$9.99 (Middle-age nurse Kate Cypher is drawn into the investigation of a murder that eerily mirrors a horrific crime committed when Kate was a girl.)
- Murphy, Warren -- Bloodline \$9.99 (NYC, 1920: Tony Falcone is a respected cop. His sons Tommy and Mario are a cop and a priest. But when their cousin Nilo arrives in the US, he falls in with a Mafia boss. As the city begins to erupt into a violent gangland war, Tommy and Mario struggle to stay out of Nilo's dark world, but when things take a turn for the worse, the Mafia may be the only place for them to go.)
- Ohlsson, Kristina -- The Chosen \$17.00 (Fredrika Bergman #5: When a Jewish teacher is shot to death, and a few hours later two Jewish boys go missing, Fredrika Bergman and Alex Recht of the Stockholm police face their toughest challenge ever.)
- Olsen, Gregg -- Just Try to Stop Me \$9.99
 (Waterman & Stark #3: PBO; A serial killer has escaped from prison and is plotting her revenge, determined that this time, detective Kendall Stark and forensic pathologist Birdy Waterman won't be able to stop her.)

- Patterson, J/Ledwidge, M -- Merry Christmas,
 Alec Cross \$7.99 (Alex Cross #20: Cross is
 ripped away from his family on Christmas Eve by
 a hostage situation that's about to explode.)
- Pavone, Chris -- The Expats \$9.99 (Anthony winner, Edgar and Thriller finalist. When her husband is offered a job in Luxembourg, Kate Moore jumps at the chance to leave her own double life behind. But when another American couple arrives, she grows to suspect that they are not who they claim to be. Is her own past catching up with her?)
- Plakcy, Neil S. -- The Next One Will Kill You \$14.99 (Angus Green #1: When his fellow agents find out he was involved in a strip trivia contest at a Miami gay bar, Angus Green is worried it will crash his FBI career. Instead, he's moved from a desk job to a case that brings mayhem at every turn.)
- Pressey, Rose -- Haunted Is Always in Fashion \$7.99 (Haunted Vintage #4: PBO; Cookie has agreed to share her fashion expertise with a local writer. When the woman is shot dead, Cookie picks up the thread of the story with help from her psychic cat and a couple of inquisitive ghosts. To unmask the killer, she'll have to lift the lid on family secrets.)
- Sebestyen, Victor -- 1946: The Making of the Modern World \$18.00 (Drawing on new archival material and interviews, journalist Sebestyen reviews major postwar decisions, discussing the economic collapse, starvation,

- ethnic cleansing, and displacement that followed WWII.)
- Simenon, Georges -- Maigret's First Case \$12.00 (Maigret #30: When a Paris musician witnesses an altercation that may have become a murder, he heads to the nearest police station, and the young Maigret becomes embroiled in his first case.)

- Freeman, Philip -- Sacrifice \$14.95 (Sister Deirdre #2: 6th century Ireland: At Saint Brigid's monastery, someone is slaying nuns in the manner of ancient Druid sacrifices. Can Sister Deidre, torn between Christianity and her own Druidic heritage, find the killer before the cycle of sacrifices is complete?)
- Haas, Derek -- A Different Lie \$14.95 (Silver Bear #4: Columbus has a new contract: kill Castillo, a brash young assassin who Columbus soon realizes is a younger version of himself.)

- Preston, D/Child, L -- Beyond the Ice Limit \$7.99 Mass Market PB, \$20.00 Unabridged Audio CDs (Gideon Crew #4: 5 years ago, a gigantic meteorite actually a complex organism from the reaches of space implanted itself deep

under the ocean. Now it's growing, and the mission to save the planet requires Gideon's expertise with nuclear weapons. He and his team soon discover the organism has no intention of going quietly.)

Rankin, Ian -- Even Dogs in the Wild \$15.99
(John Rebus #20: After a lawyer is killed during a robbery, DI Siobhan Clarke discovers a note indicating the attack might not have been random. When local gangster Big Ger Cafferty receives an identical message, Clarke calls in the recently retired John Rebus to help.

Together the two old adversaries might just stand a chance of saving Cafferty's skin.)

Rollins, James -- The Seventh Plague \$27.99
(SIGMA Force #12: After two years, a missing archaeologist reappears in the Egyptian desert, but dies before he can explain what happened. But something had begun mummifying his body while he was still alive. It's up to SIGMA Force to figure out what's going on; Signed copies expected)

Early January

Abbott, Kristi -- Pop Goes the Murder \$7.99 (Popcorn Shop #2: PBO; Rebecca's ex Antoine has offered to feature her products on his popular cooking shows. When Antoine's assistant is murdered, Rebecca sets out to clear Antoine's name.)

- Adler-Olsen, Jussi -- The Hanging Girl \$16.00 (Department Q #6: The team's latest cold case, the hanging death of a teen girl, takes them to the remote Danish island of Bornholm and a sunworshipping cult. Carl, Assad, Rose, and Gordon must stop a string of murders and a skilled manipulator who refuses to let anything get in his way.)
- Airth, Rennie -- The Death of Kings \$27.00 (John Madden #5: The 1938 murder of an actress, on the estate of a friend of the Prince of Wales, was closed quickly when a local troublemaker confessed. With danger mounting and no one else they can trust, they set out to uncover the truth.)
- Christie, A/Harkup, K -- A Is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie \$17.00 (Agatha finalist. Research chemist Harkup looks at the fourteen poisons Christie used to kill characters in her novels, each carefully chosen to provide vital clues in the discovery of the murderer.)

- Hiebert, Michael -- Close to the Broken Hearted \$9.99 (Leah Teal #2: Convinced that she is being stalked by the man who shot her baby brother years ago, young mother Sylvie Carson

- turns to Leah Teal, the only detective in their small Alabama town, for help.)
- Ho-Kei, Chan -- The Borrowed \$16.00 (Legendary Hong Kong detective Kwan Chun-dok's career spans fifty years. Here we learn about six of his major cases, each taking place at a pivotal moment in Hong Kong history, from the 1960s to the present day.)

- Page, Katherine Hall -- The Body in the Wardrobe \$7.99 (Faith Fairchild #22: Yankee attorney

- Sophie Maxwell found a dead body, but no one believes her, except her good friend Faith Fairchild. The two women pair up to unmask a killer.)
- Parker, R/Knott, R -- Blackjack \$9.99 (Cole & Hitch #8: There's new trouble in Appaloosa: Boston Bill Black, owner of the new casino. The man vanishes when word comes through he's wanted for murder. It's up to territorial marshals Virgil Cole and Everett Hitch to track him down.)

- Brekke, Jorgen -- **Dreamless** \$15.99 (Odd Singsaker #2: When a singer is murdered and another singer disappears, Chief Inspector Odd Singsaker and the Trondheim police discover both cases are somehow connected to a centuries-old lullaby.)

 with no sign of the gun, Inspector French finds
 himself investigating a world of high-powered
 banking, luxury yachts, and international

 servant.)
- Tate, Clover -- **Blown Away** \$7.99 (Kite Shop #1: PBO; Emmy has moved to the Oregon coast to start her own kite business. When she finds a dead man on the beach, and her best friend becomes a suspect, Emmy is determined to find the real killer.)
- Waggoner, Tim -- xXx: Return of Xander Cage \$7.99 (PBO; Novelization of the film.)
- Wallace, Auralee -- Snowed In with Murder \$7.99 (Otter Lake #3: PBO; Erica planned to keep her winter visit to Otter Lake free of sleuthing and hijinks, but a guest has been murdered at her mother's retreat. With the island snowed in, Erica has to muster up some investigative skills to reveal the killer.)
- Wegelius, Jakob -- The Murderer's Ape \$17.99
 (Ages 12 and up. Sally Jones is a gorilla who moves among humans. She doesn't speak, but understands everything. She and the Chief are devoted comrades who operate a cargo boat. When one of their deals ends badly, the Chief is falsely accused of murder. For Sally Jones, this is the start of a harrowing quest to survive and to clear the Chief's name.)

- #33: Police sergeant Hamish Macbeth and policeman Charlie Carson investigate reports of eerie lights and noises at a ruined castle. They find no sign of a ghost, but they do find a dead body in the cellar.)
- Brody, Frances -- A Death in the Dales \$25.99 (Kate Shackleton #7: 1920s: On a holiday trip to Yorkshire, Kate becomes embroiled in the search for a missing boy, and uncovers a suspicious death.)

Or does someone take care of the senile spy for good? These are River Cartwright's questions when his grandfather develops dementia. And that's not all the agents of Slough House have to worry about after a bomb goes off in the middle of a busy shopping center.)
- Holt, Anne -- The Lion's Mouth \$16.00 (Hanne Wilhelmsen #4: The Norwegian Prime Minister has been shot in the head. Was it politically motivated, or personal? When secrets begin to unravel from the PM's past, Hanne and her partner Billy must piece together the crime before a private tragedy becomes a public outcry.)
- James, Miranda -- Twelve Angry Librarians \$26.00 (Cat in the Stacks #8: The Southern Academic Libraries Association is holding their annual meeting at Athena College, with the keynote speech to be delivered by Charlie's high school nemesis. When the irritating man is

- found dead, Charlie is at the top of the suspect list. Charlie and Diesel will have to check out every clue to catch the killer.)
- Jones, Stephen Mack -- August Snow \$25.95
 (The son of an African American father and a Mexican mother, August Snow joined the Detroit police only to be drummed out of the force by a conspiracy of corrupt cops and politicians. Powerful businesswoman Eleanore Paget wants him to investigate unusual happenings at her bank, but Snow turns her down. When she dies the next day, an apparent suicide, August isn't buying it, and starts asking questions.)
- Lansdale, Joe R. -- Honky Tonk Samurai \$15.99
 (Hap & Leonard #9: Hap Collins is a former 1960s activist and self-proclaimed white trash rebel. Leonard Pine is a tough, gay, black Vietnam veteran and Republican. Lilly Buckner brings a cold case to their new PI office: she wants them to look for her missing granddaughter. They discover that the used car lot where the young woman worked is a front for a prostitution ring, and the mystery of her disappearance only deepens from there.)
- Lansdale, Joe R. -- Rusty Puppy \$26.00 (Hap & Leonard #10: Hap and Leonard investigate the murder of a young black man who had been asking too many questions about the racist police force in their East Texas town.)
- Lippman, Laura -- Wilde Lake \$15.99 (Lu Brant's first case as state's attorney dredges up painful memories of 1980, when her brother A.J. saved his best friend at the cost of

- another man's life. Now she wonders if the events happened as she remembers, and what details might have been withheld from her because she was a child. The more she learns about the case, the more questions arise.)
- Monday, T.T. -- Double Switch \$16.00 (Johnny Adcock #2: When rookie phenom Yonel Ruiz is threatened by a cartel of smugglers, relief pitcher / PI Johnny Adcock investigates.)
- Pattison, Eliot -- Soul of the Fire \$15.99
 (Shan Tao Yun #8: Startled to be chosen to fill a vacancy on an international commission investigating Tibetan suicides, Shan Tao Yun soon learns that his predecessor was murdered, and that the commission is presenting self-immolation protests as acts of crime and terrorism. When he discovers that the most recent immolation was actually a murder, he must make a desperate effort to uncover the commission's secrets.)
- Perry, Anne -- Treachery at Lancaster Gate \$16.00 (Thomas Pitt #31: When a bomb goes off during an important - and secret - police raid, killing several officers, Pitt investigates. The evidence trail leads him straight to a deadly crime in the drawing rooms of London's elite.)
- Royal, Priscilla -- The Proud Sinner \$15.95 (Prioress Eleanor #13: 1282 CE: Seven abbots are en route to meet a papal legate in Norfolk, but stop at the priory when one of them falls ill. The man dies horribly, and then another

- falls ill. And another. Can Prioress Eleanor and her associates find out who is responsible?)
- Siciliano, Sam -- The Moonstone's Curse \$12.95 (Further Adventures of Sherlock Holmes: Charles Bromley's wife has refused an offer to sell a family diamond that is said to be cursed. When a jeweler is murdered and the diamond is stolen, Holmes and Vernier must try to unravel a mystery centuries in the making.)
- Sigurdardottir, Yrsa -- The Undesired \$25.99 (Odinn is looking into alleged abuse at a juvenile detention center in rural Iceland, following the unexplained death of the colleague who was previously running the investigation. The more he finds out, the more it looks like there are links to odd events there in the 1970s.)
- Todd, Charles -- Racing the Devil \$26.99
 (Ian Rutledge #18: 1919: A group of British officers are racing motorcars from Paris to Nice. When two of their vehicles are nearly run off the road, no one will admit knowing which driver was responsible. A year later, Inspector Rutledge investigates a fatal crash in the South Downs. Is it connected to the events in France?)
- Webb, Betty -- Desert Vengeance \$15.95 (Lena Jones #9: The pedophile who raped Scottsdale PI Lena Jones when she was a foster child has been released from prison. When the man's wife (who knew about his crimes but did nothing) and then the man are found gruesomely

murdered, suspicion falls first on Lena, and then on the man's other victims.)

Winspear, Jacqueline -- Journey to Munich \$15.99 (Maisie Dobbs #12: 1938: When the German government agrees to release a British citizen from Dachau, the British Secret Service sends Maisie to collect the man. In the heart of Nazi Germany, she encounters unexpected dangers.)
